# Hench Charges Sneak-ins in BA Pre-Registration

Dr. William M. Hench, professor of international trade, last night told members of the Business Administration Student Council that one of the difficulties of the senior pre-registration program is that some underclassmen try to "sneak in" on the program.

Hench said students "like the type of set up" of the pre-registration program initiated two years ago, because it permits business majors to reserve courses in the college which they need for graduation.

He said he could not see any way to avoid the problem a student faces who finds a non-business course he signs up for during the official registration period conflicts with a pre-registered course.

But Hench said underclassmen who try to get by pre-registration should face some sort of disciplinary action.

The council also nominated Eugene Curry, James Meister, Albert Litman, Burton Hollander and Theodore Dempsey to attend the National Association of Manufacturers' Convention in New York. Three delegates will be selected.

Michael Walker, president of the council, appointed Charles Gorka chairman of a committee to revise the constitution.

# Faculty to Hear Council Report On 'LA' Day

The Liberal Arts Student Council Tuesday night unanimously voted to send a representative to report on a prospective career day to the college faculty at its meeting Oct. 24.

Lynn Ward, junior in journalism from Paoli, was named to give the report. Barbara Martino, junior in arts and letters from Wheeling, W. Va., and Susan Sunderland, sophomore in arts and letters from Pittsburgh, will also represent the council at the faculty meeting.

However, the Liberal Arts career day is still in the planning stage. Most of the plans should be drawn up in time to be reported to the faculty.

Sandra Gusky, sophomore in journalism from Pittsburgh, chairman of the committee to investigate the career day, presented a progress report to the council. She said she talked with Donald M. Cook, assistant director of the University Placement Service, who suggested having the career day in the spring.

Cook also suggested a supplementary program for the fall jointly sponsored by the Placement Office and the Liberal Arts Student Council. He recommended a seminar to teach prospective interviewees how to correctly fill out applications when looking for a job.

# State College Flying Service Submits Low Training Bid

The State College Flying Service has submitted the low bid to provide flight training for selected Reserve Officers Training Corps students at the University.

The proposed flight-training program would be part of a national experiment to pre-test senior ROTC students who have been singled out for pilot training when they actually enter military service.

If negotiations for the program materialize, the University will have contracts with the Army and the Air Force to train these students.

The University will lease an area of land 300 feet wide and 4500 feet long, which the bidder will prepare as a grass landing strip.

The land is situated on the northeast edge of University property comprising what has been called the Krape and Musser farms. It parallels Legislative Road 14062.

Charles Scott, engineer for John McShane, Inc., contractors for the project, said workmen now are engaged in major excavation. A three-quarter yard shovel has been brought in for this job.

In describing the new residence area, Scott said the architecture will resemble the women's dorms being built now. The halls will be four stories high but will be L-shaped.

Three of the dorms will be constructed along Park Ave. The 2-story dining hall and the fourth residence hall will be built along Shortlidge Rd. Each dorm will have an elevator for student use.

A large recreation area will be a part of the residence unit. Four basketball courts, three tennis courts and four handball courts will be included in this area. A special plot will be set aside for horseshoe pitching and softball. There will also be an open play area 224 feet by 100 feet.

Scott said that the gravel parking lot which bordered the macadam walk along Hort Woods has been eliminated. One of the residence hall units will occupy part of this area and the tennis courts will include.
