

# Ebaugh Given Post As Research Dean

Paul Ebaugh, professor of engineering research, has been named to the newly-created position of assistant dean for research in the College of Engineering and Architecture.

Establishment of the new position was approved at a meeting of the Board of Trustees where a reorganization of research activities in the college was approved.

The Department of Engineering Research will be replaced by the Engineering Experiment Department, which will be headed by Elmer R. Queer, head of the Department of Engineering Research. He will have the title of director of the Engineering Experiment Department as well as professor of engineering research.

The new Engineering Experiment Department will be responsible for establishing and conducting services of an engineering nature for the state and the nation and will be concerned with both governmental and industrial type work. The Thermal Laboratory and the Advisory Service to State Institutions will remain with the department which will administer the evaluation programs.

Ebaugh will assume responsibility for the promotion of re-

search, both on and off the campus.

Ebaugh, who was graduated with honors in physics from Denison University, was named to the faculty in 1945 as assistant professor of engineering research.

Prior to his appointment he was a research associate with the Harvard Underwater Sound Laboratory, a research chemist with Basic Refractories, Inc., Tiffin, Ohio, and a research chemist with Owens Fiberglas Corp., Newark, Ohio.

Queer received his bachelor of science and master of science degrees in electrical engineering at the University and has been on the faculty since 1928. He was named head of the Department of Engineering Research when it was organized in 1952.

# 'Thieves' Plan To Practice 'Put-Pocketing'

Dr. Mary P. Shelton, associate professor of clothing and textile research, and director of the Ellen H. Richards Institute, has been given a leave until Feb. 1 to visit textile research laboratories in universities throughout the country.

Ruth E. Gates, instructor in clothing and textiles, will be on leave until Feb. 1 to work full-time toward her doctor of philosophy degree at the University under a General Foods Corporation fellowship.

Guy H. Temple, assistant county agricultural agent, has been given a leave until June 15 to work for his master of science degree in rural sociology here. George B. Lott and Ian B. Strong, research assistants at the Ordnance Research Laboratory, will be on leave during the current year to do graduate work.

Leaves have been approved for Irwin Geller, research assistant in fuel technology, and Bert Phillips, research assistant in geochemistry, to do graduate work. Robert R. Grooms, a counselor in the Division of Counseling, has been given a year's leave to work

toward a doctor of philosophy degree at the University.

Dr. Martin W. Schein, assistant professor of animal behavior, has received a leave until Oct. 19, to do additional work for the U.S. Public Health Service.

Additional leaves have been approved for Dr. William M. Breazeale, professor of nuclear engineering, until Jan. 31; Edward R. Gilkey, instructor in speech, until June 30, and John Holub, research assistant in the reactor facility, until Dec. 31.

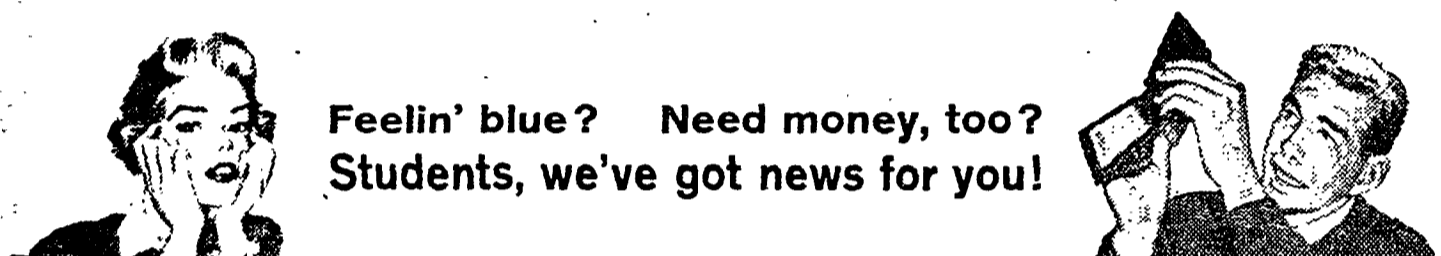
