

3 Houses Will Get IFC Awards Tonight

Scholarship trophies will be presented to Pi Sigma Upsilon, Beta Theta Pi and Alpha Zeta at tonight's Interfraternity Council Banquet.

J. Edward Murphy, treasurer of the National Interfraternity Conference, will address the banquet, scheduled for 7 tonight at the Nittany Lion Inn.

The banquet marks the close of the 3-day IFC workshop program. Each fraternity is asked to send the chapter adviser and one representative from the chapter.

Murphy, an executive with the Bell Telephone Company in Philadelphia, is the past national president of Sigma Nu. He has served on the NIC's executive committee for more than three years, and formerly was chairman of the conference's Undergraduate Relations committee.

The three trophies to be presented are in recognition of scholastic achievements. The Sigma Chi improvement trophy, awarded to the house which shows the most improvement in scholarship, will go to Pi Sigma Upsilon.

Beta Theta Pi will receive the scholarship trophy awarded to the social fraternity with the highest semester average. The trophy for

the professional fraternity with the highest average goes to Alpha Zeta.

Summaries will be given by each of the workshop chairmen on the progress made during the program.

Ten workshops were held, to study various problems confronted by fraternities.
