

Cabinet OK's Report Of Atmosphere 'Shop' TIM Council Upholds Rotation System

All-University Cabinet last night approved with no revisions the report of the Academic Atmosphere Workshop of Student Encampment.

One proposed amendment—to remove a part of the report recommending stiffer admissions policies—was defeated by Cabinet.

Group Will Begin Study Of Rotation

All-University Elections Committee will begin an immediate study of the fraternity-independent rotation system, according to chairman Peter Fishburn.

But Fishburn said it is "very doubtful" that the present rotation plan will be changed before the fall elections of freshman and sophomore class officers.

As the Elections Code now stands, the president and secretary-treasurer of the sophomore class must be fraternity members. The vice president must be an independent. All freshmen candidates are considered independents.

Students running for the sophomore positions must have a minimum 2.4 All-University average. This qualification was voted into the Elections Code by All-University Cabinet last semester.

The Elections Committee will meet at 6:15 p.m. Sunday in 10 Sparks to approve a schedule for the political parties' nominations of candidates, campaigning, reviewing of party platforms, elections and meetings with the clique officers before and after the elections.

A tentative schedule has been set up, subject to committee approval. The final schedule will be announced at the clique meetings of both Lion and Campus parties at 7 p.m. Sunday. Elections Committee members will register party members and hand out party cards at the meetings.

Michelson to Be AeroEng Head

Dr. Irving Michelson, a specialist in aerodynamics, acoustics and space flight, has been named professor and head of the Department of Aeronautical Engineering.

His appointment was approved at the weekend meeting of the executive committee of the Board of Trustees. He fills the position held by Harold M. Hipsh until his death on May 23.

Michelson, whose appointment became effective Aug. 1, has been president of Odin Associates, Pasadena, Calif., an engineering research organization engaged in advanced studies for military agencies and missile developers. Michelson was a research engineer at the California Institute of Technology in Pasadena when he founded the company in 1954.
