

Home Ec Council Increases News and Views Allotment

The Home Economics Student Council has voted to give \$375 to News and Views, the Home Economics College magazine.

The allotment to the magazine last year was \$300. The increase was voted after Karen Bixler, editor, told the council Tuesday that the cost of printing had increased \$1 a page.

She said the cost of including more pictures, as was recommended by the council last year, would further increase the cost of publishing the magazine.

The council appointed seven members to supervise the freshman elections. They are James Knipe, David Allison, Annie Reese, Orlin Davis, Constance Hindman, Judith Heckert and Louise White.

A self-nomination box for freshmen will be in the lobby of the

Home Economics Building Oct. 21 through 25. Freshmen must submit a picture and a list of high school or college activities when they nominate themselves.

The elections will be held Oct. 30 and 31.

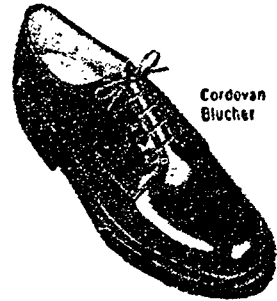

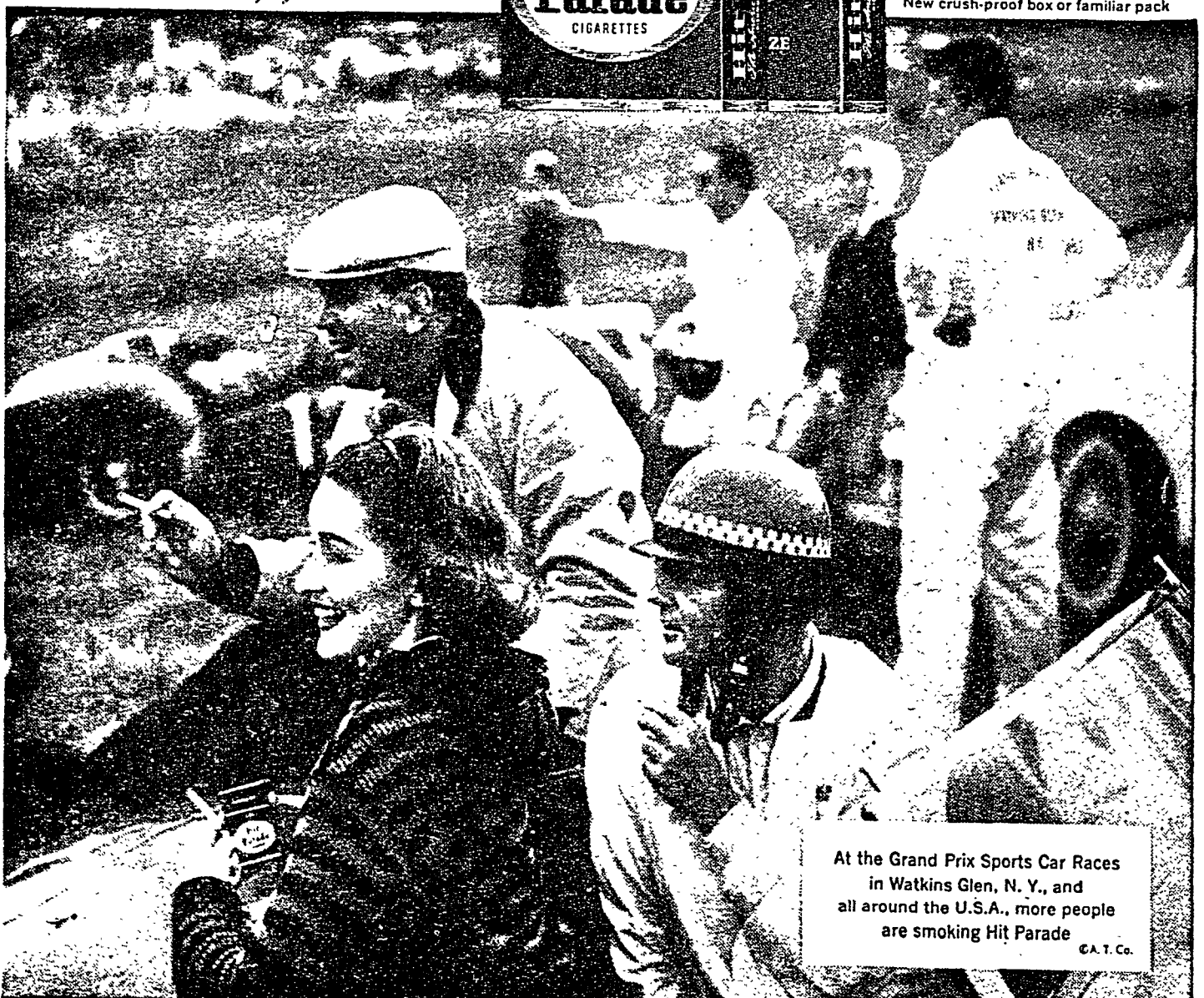
