

Soccer Tutor Revamps Lineup for Syracuse Tilt

It is usually the practice of soccer boss Ken Hosterman to alter his starting lineup several times during the season. This afternoon is the first time.

Three "new" men will be inserted in the starting array when the Lions try for their third straight win of the campaign against low-rated Syracuse. However, only one of these men will be in a regular role for the first time.

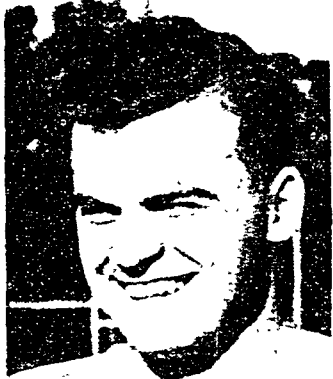
He is sophomore Pete Wadsworth, one of the standouts in last Saturday's 2-1 win over Maryland. Wadsworth will start at inside right today in place of Ihor Chyzowych who was transferred to left wing because of an ankle injury to Louis VanRafelghem, the regular at the left terminal. VanRafelghem, who was racked-up in the Maryland clash, didn't even make the jaunt to New York.

The other "fresh" starters will be junior Herb Hertner and senior Tony Tremonte. Hertner, a regular last fall, will replace Walt Krauser at right halfback and Tremonte will move into Paul Bauer's vacated right fullback slot.

"I have no reason for starting Hertner and Tremonte instead of the other two boys," Hosterman commented yesterday. "They are all of equal ability and one can do the job just as good as the other."

Outside of these three man-

vers, the Nittanies' first platoon will be the same which opened the season against Bucknell two Saturdays ago. Captain Ralph Brower will join Tremonte at

ly-touted credentials at center forward; and Don Dougald will handle the net-guarding chores.

Dougald was absent from the Maryland squeaker because of his brother's wedding and his position was shared by junior Jerry Bruce and sophomore Ralph Becker. The latter will be seen in the reserve goalie post today.

Hosterman will also have wingman Dave Haase, inside forward Loren Kline, Krauser and Bauer on his bench force.

"I don't expect Syracuse to be as tough as Maryland," Hosterman said in his pre-game outlook, "but I don't want the boys to take them lightly. They haven't been too formidable a foe in the past three years but you never know what they could come up with."

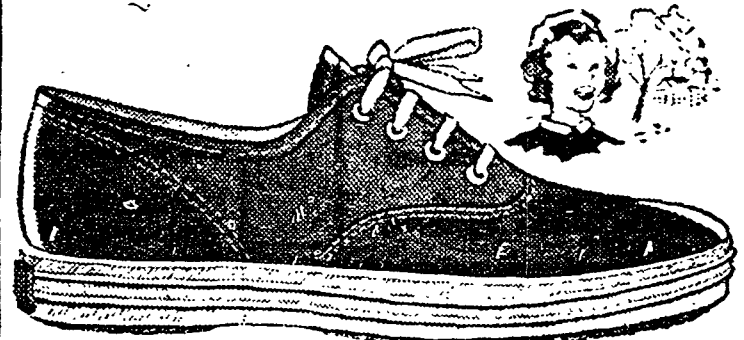

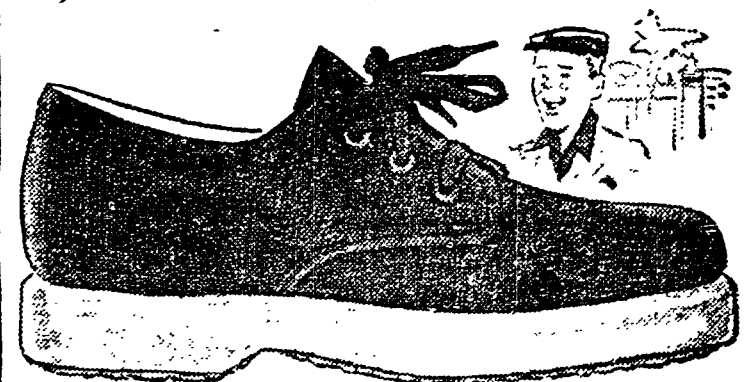
