

Lion Votes Against Rotation; Campus Fills 8 Clique Posts

Lion party members on Sunday night unanimously approved a statement asking abolition of the rotation system for choosing candidates for All-University offices.

The statement was issued jointly last week by William O'Neill, Lion party clique chairman, and Gary Young, Campus party clique chairman. It proposes eliminating the fraternity-independent rotation system for the All-University president, vice president and secretary-treasurer.

Lion party's steering committee, which met Sunday afternoon, also voted unanimously to back the statement.

The 201 clique members at the meeting included 94 students who received their party cards and were able to vote in the internal clique elections and 107 who registered for cards and set in a non-voting section.

John Fenimore was elected freshman clique chairman. He defeated William Lockerman for the office. Jerome Nichols was elected sophomore clique chairman.

Others elected to internal clique posts were: Lynda Goldman, freshman women's vice clique chairman; Robert Umstead, freshman men's vice clique chairman; and Sandra Berrell, freshman clique secretary-treasurer. Miss Berrell defeated Carol Schmidt.

Dorothy Newman, sophomore women's vice clique chairman; Ray Klinedinsdt, sophomore men's vice clique chairman; and Ann Harrington, sophomore clique secretary-treasurer. Miss Harrington defeated Jacquelyn Ralston.

Book Collection To Honor Prof

Dr. Francis J. Tschan, professor emeritus of European history, will be honored by a memorial fund for the purchase of books on medieval history for the Pattee Library.

The fund, sponsored by the history department, will be administered by the Penn State Foundation.

Tschan, who died in July, taught at the University from 1925 to 1946. He wrote numerous books and articles on subjects within the European history field.

A native of Germany, Tschan came to the United States as a child. He was graduated from Loyola University with a bachelor's, master's and doctor's degrees in law. He received his doctor of philosophy degree from the University of Chicago.
