

# Frosh, Soph Elections Scheduled for November

All-University Elections Committee has chosen Nov. 13 and 14 for the election of freshmen and sophomore class officers.

Elections Committee has approved a complete schedule for nominations, campaigns, elections and meetings with clique officials.

The schedule for events preceding the elections is:

•Sunday—Preliminary nominations will be held at 7 p.m. in Sparks. Both Lion and Campus parties will hold nominations for positions on the parties' slates for president, vice president and secretary-treasurer of the freshman and sophomore classes.

•Oct. 21—Lists of clique members must be given to Fishburn by 5 p.m., and \$25 must be on deposit with the Associated Student Activities fund.

•Oct. 27—Final nominations and elections of candidates will be held at the clique meetings at 7 p.m. in Sparks. Students will be required to show party cards and matriculation cards for admission to these meetings.

•Oct. 30—Deadline for parties to hand in their platforms, and lists of candidates and their transcripts. Elections committee will meet at 7 p.m. in 213 HUB to review the platforms.

•Nov. 3—The committee will meet to pass on any platform planks not approved Oct. 30.

•Nov. 4—Campaigning will begin at 8 a.m. Total expenses for publicity may not exceed \$150 per clique, and must be paid by the clique.

•Nov. 12—Elections Committee will meet at 7 p.m. with the clique chairmen to answer any questions, clarify the Elections Code (Continued on page eight)

# Workers Begin Painting Lobby Of Old Main

The lobby of Old Main is having its face lifted, and the result will be a much brighter color scheme.

Workmen last week began painting the main lobby, including the huge pillars, an off-white color.

Charles A. Lamm, head of the division of building maintenance and operation, said the object of the project is to make the lobby lighter. The new color scheme will cover dark grey and maroon walls and pillars.

Lamm said the painting will not affect the large murals on the second floor of the main lobby.

University workmen also are engaged in a project on the fourth floor of Old Main, renovating rooms to make an office suite for one of the administration departments.

Lamm also said two rooms at the front of the first floor of Willard Building are being remodeled and repainted to make office space for the Graduate School department. The rooms formerly were used for classes.
