Forster, who has been in Finland for the past year as a lecturer at the University of Helsinki, has traveled extensively throughout the country.

He writes, "We'd like to think that we Penn Staters, and that means our wives and children perhaps more than us grantees, are increasing rapport at the family and academic level between America and the Finnish people who are ideologically dug in here on the border of the Soviet Union."

Gemmell's mission is two-fold: to share with the Finns American methods of management and to orient them to American methods of instruction.

He is affiliated with the Helsinki University of Economics and with the Swedish University of Economics, both in Helsinki. He is also serving as consultant to Finnish business firms and is assisting in the establishment of the Institute for Advanced Management Training in Helsinki.




