

# Professors to Attend Convention on TV

College and university professors from all parts of the country who have had experience in teaching by television will attend the Conference on Teaching by Television in Colleges and Universities, which opens here tomorrow.

About 100 teachers and other educational television personnel have accepted invitations to participate in the workshop. Sixty faculty members from the University also will attend.

Dr. John C. Adams, president of Hofstra College, will preside at the meetings. Adams is chairman of the committee on television of the American Council on Education. The Council is sponsoring the conference in conjunction with the University.

The conference will open at 4 p.m. with registration at the Nittany Lion Inn and will continue through 5 p.m. Wednesday.

Adams will give the introductory remarks at the opening session at 9 a.m. Monday in the Hetzel Union Building. After these remarks, Lawrence E. Dennis, vice president for academic affairs here, will give the welcome address.

Other University personnel who will address the conference are Dr. Clarence R. Carpenter, director of the Division of Academic

Research and Services; Leslie P. Greenhill, assistant director of the Division of Academic Research and Services; Dr. Joseph H. Grosslight, professor of psychology; and Dr. William S. Ray, associate professor of psychology.

## TV Instruction Set As Meeting Topic

Instruction by television will be the subject for an open meeting from 8:30 to 9:30 p.m. Monday in 112 Buckhout.

The speakers will be Dr. Lee J. Cronbach, professor of education and psychology at the University of Illinois, and Dr. Neil E. Miller, professor of psychology at Yale University.

Their subject will be "Theories and Principles of Learning in Relation to the Improvement of Televised Instruction."

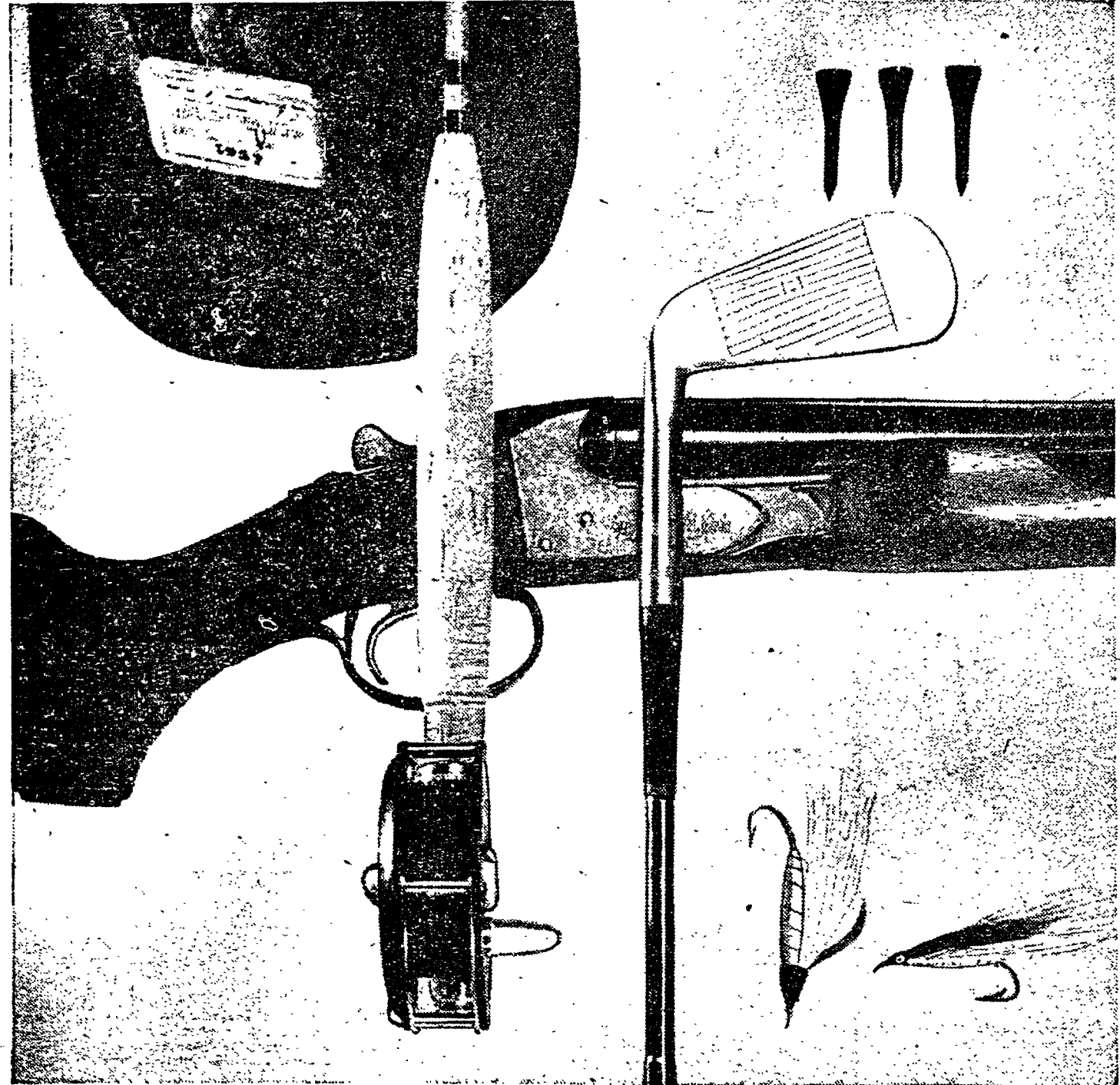
