# Sub-Groups Named From Committee

All-University Elections Committee members Sunday night were appointed to four subcommittees — the fraternity-independent rotation system, the penalization clause of the Elections Code, clique finances, and publicity for fall elections.

Theodore Haller was named chairman of the subcommittee to study the rotation plan. Marilyn Cohen is secretary. Other members are Harry Martini, Lianne Cordero, Stanley Foster and Janice Juppenlatz.

Members of the subcommittee to study the penalization clause are: Ruby Seaman, chairman, Arlene D'Onofrio, Milton McGriff and John McArthur. Peter Fishburn, Elections Committee chairman, asked the committee to begin work immediately so that the clause can be "straightened out" before the elections Nov. 13 and 14.

Named to the subcommittee to study clique finances were Frederick Taylor, chairman, Chester Zimolzak, Mary Nash and Paula Miller.

On the publicity subcommittee are Richard Armen, chairman, Matthew Mathews, Sandra Grotzky, David Faust, Barbara Martino and Patricia O'Neill. After the elections, the committee will study the issue of decentralized versus centralized voting.

When the subcommittees have completed a study of the topics they will draw up recommendations and present them to Elections Committee. If Elections Committee approves the recommendations they will go before All-University Cabinet.

Fishburn said ballots will be used in place of voting machines for the fall elections. No machines are available because of the coming state elections.
