The conference opened Sunday and will continue through tomorrow. It is sponsored by the American Council on Education and the University.

Following Walker's address, Leslie P. Greenhill, assistant director of the Division of Academic Research and Services, and Hideya Kumata, of Michigan State University, will review results of research on TV instruction.

Dr. Clarence H. Faust, president of the Fund for the Advancement of Education, will speak on "Philosophy of Education in Relation to Televised Instruction" at a dinner meeting at 6:30 tonight at the Nittany Lion Inn.

A panel discussion on the "Effects of College Cultural Patterns on Students' Learning from Televised Instruction" will be held at 10:45 a.m. today.

Another panel on "Practical Problems on the Improvement of Televised Instruction" will be held at 1:30 p.m. today. Dr. William S. Ray, associate professor of psychology, is a member of the panel.

A demonstration of teaching by television is scheduled for 9 tonight in Sparks.
