

Borough Police Impose Fines On 45 Students

Fourteen students were fined during September by State College Borough Police for moving motor violations.

A total of 31 other students were fined for borough parking violations.

Joseph Polasstre of Shamokin was fined on two counts, driving on the left side of the highway and driving without wearing glasses as required.
