Choir Will Sing Quartet Tickets During Vespers Now Available

Hymn singing has been planned for the vesper program at 4:30 p.m. today in the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Chapel.

The Meditation Chapel Choir, directed by William Reeves, will sing "The Reformation Chorale" harmonized by Bach. The choir also will lead the congregation in singing German chorales and hymns from the Genevan and Scottish psalters.

The Rev. Luther H. Harshbarger, University chaplain, will speak on "The Significance of Hymns in Worship."

A Reformation Day vesper service will be held at 4:30 p.m. Thursday. The Rev. Preston Williams, assistant chaplain, will speak on "Our Heritage for Today." The women's choir will sing.

A total of 688 tickets will be available to students today at the Hetzel Union desk for the Hungarian Quartet concert, scheduled for 8:30 p.m. Monday in Schwab Auditorium.

Of the 950 tickets made available for student distribution at 1 p.m. yesterday, 262 were given out by 5 p.m.

The tickets will be available to students upon presentation of their matriculation card from 9 a.m. to noon and from 1 to 5 p.m. at the HUB desk.

Tickets will go on sale to non-students at 9 a.m. tomorrow. They will be on sale from 9 a.m. to noon and from 1 to 5 p.m. tomorrow and Thursday. Tickets cost \$1.25 each.

If any tickets remain after the sale, they will again be available to students from 9 a.m. to noon and from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. Monday.

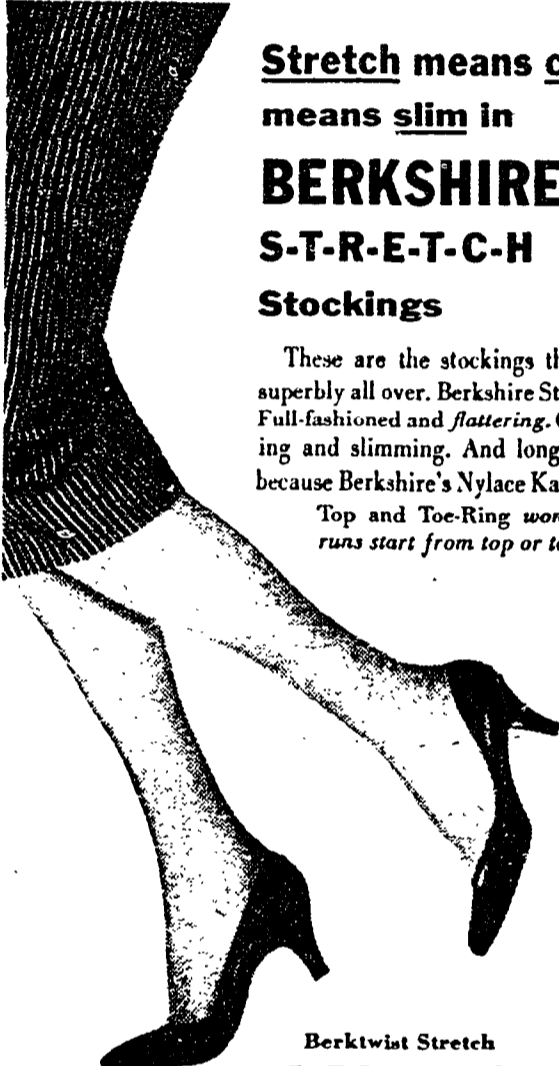

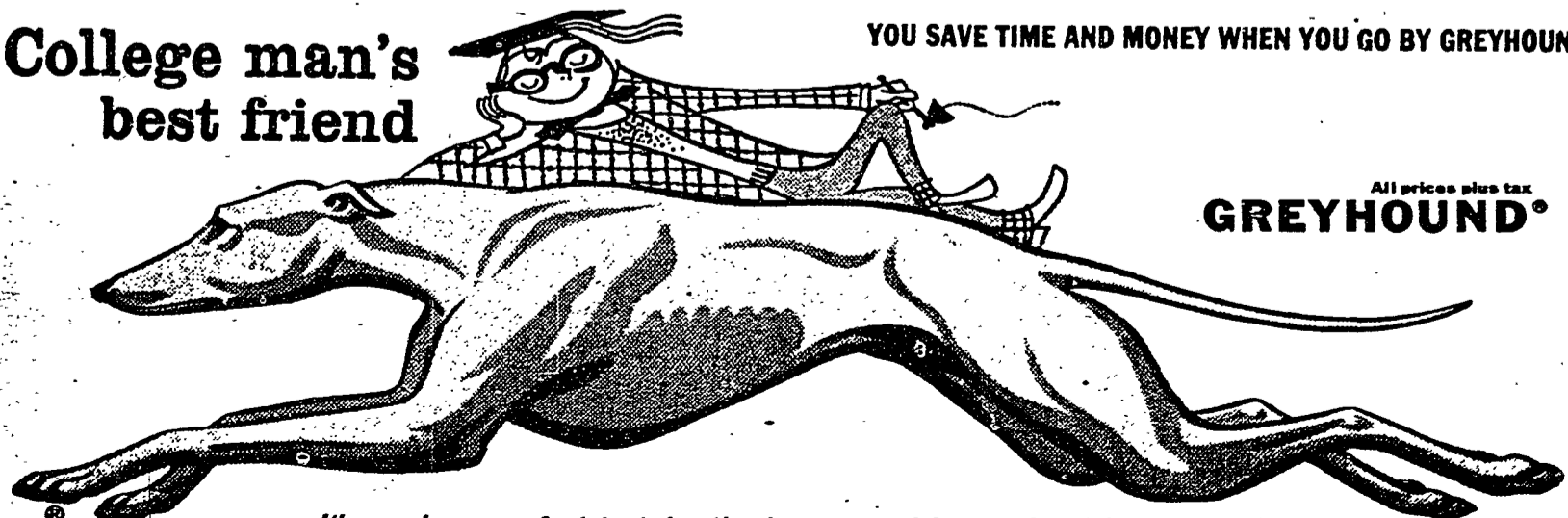
