Insurance program— We propose that the student government recommend to the University that a University-sponsored student insurance plan be initiated to provide additional accident and illness coverage for students.

 Toward promotion of educational freedom: Reserve officers' training program— We feel that while a program of military training has undeniable merits. mandatory participation definitely involves a curtailment of educational freedom. Therefore, mili-tary courses should be elective in accordance with the interpreta-tion of the Morrill Act by the United States Attorney General. which states that while military training must be offered to the students of a land-grant institution, it need not be mandatory.
