

Frosh Council Elections Will Be Continued Today

The elections for freshmen representatives to six student councils will continue today and the ballots will be counted at 5 p.m. by All-University Elections Committee and representatives from the councils.

Peter Fishburn, committee chairman, estimated that not more than 300 freshmen voted yesterday. He said, "It was a real slow day." Last year's first day of council elections also was slow, The Daily Collegian reported.

Elections Committee counted ballots for the Home Economics Student Council yesterday. Thirty-four freshmen had voted.

Ballot boxes from the other councils will be opened tonight for the first time.

Fishburn said yesterday's heaviest turnouts seemed to be for the Liberal Arts, Chemistry-Physics and Business Administration Student Councils.

As freshmen vote their matriculation cards are punched in the upper right hand corner. Fishburn reminded freshmen to take their matriculation cards to the polls with them.
