

# Men May Indicate Housing Preference

Nittany and Pollock council members have begun conducting a survey as to student preferences on rooming assignments for the spring semester in conjunction with the opening of Thompson Hall to male students.

The poll is being taken in conjunction with the Department of Housing and will give the department the number and names of students wishing assignments in Thompson Hall for the spring semester.

About 1600 men will be contacted by dormitory unit presidents and will be given a printed form to be filled out. The student may either signify his desire to be transferred to the West Halls area or his desire to remain in the Nittany and Pollock area.

Francis H. Gordon, room assignment officer for the Department of Housing, has urged students to fill out the forms immediately and return them to their unit president.

The survey forms must be returned to Thomas G. Williams, Nittany and Pollock counselor co-ordinator, by 5 p.m. today. Over the weekend the forms will be filed alphabetically into two groups, those wishing to be transferred and those wishing to remain.

# Cabinet Drops Accusations in Report

All-University Cabinet has deleted from a workshop report items which accused the University of "inadequate opportunities," "absence of responsible guidance," "absence of a policy" and "absence of publicity," all with regard to student recreation.

These statements were listed as a preface to the recommendations made in the report of Student Encampment workshop on Regulations, Controls and Student Welfare: "That the Administrative Committee on Student Affairs create a sub-committee on recreation."

Joseph Boehret, All-University secretary-treasurer, moved that the statements be removed because, he said, he believes he can not justify to his "conscience" the endorsement of such statements by adopting the complete recommendation.

But David Faust, chairman of

the encampment committee, said statements to this effect were included in a report to the Middle States Accreditation Team presented by the College of Physical Education.

Further, Faust said, the report indicated a decrease in recreational facilities in the face of a continual increase in enrollment.

The Middle States Team, according to Faust, agreed with the report and found the statements to be accurate.

The particular opinion in the report that Faust said was also voiced by the College of Physical Education and the Middle States Team was:

"There are inadequate social

and recreational opportunities and programs for University students. Under the present situation, social and recreation services are provided through independent student groups, several colleges and administrative agencies."

Ross B. Lehman, adviser to Cabinet, questioned the word "inadequate." He said many recreation and social clubs disband from time to time, indicating that the supply of opportunities is greater than the demand.

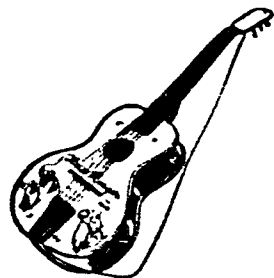

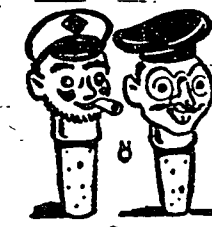

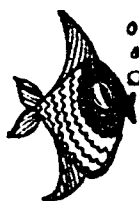
