

Harriers Finish Third in IC4-A's

The Nittany Lion varsity and freshman cross-country teams duplicated last year's third place finishes in the IC4-A Championships yesterday at Van Cortlandt Park in New York City.

Defending champion Michigan State annexed the team title by taking 1st, 7th, 8th, 15th and 55th for a total of 86 points. Notre Dame was second with 102 points, followed by Penn State with 119 points.

Captain Fred Kerr was the Lion's top finisher, running the 5-mile course in 25:06 for a ninth place. Sophomore Dick Engelbrink was the second Nittany runner to cross the line, placing 15th in 25:22.

State College's Clem Schoenebeck took 25th in 25:35, with Ed Moran crossing the line 19 seconds later in the 30th position.

Junior Chick King finished 46th for the Lions in 26:16, with sophomore Joe Thompson placing 70th in 26:42. Al Jones, the only senior on the Lion squad, took 81st in 26:53.

Two-time individual champion Henry Kennedy of Michigan faltered badly at the third mile and finished eighth in 25:04, but his younger brother, Forry, kept the individual title in the family by taking the varsity title in 24:14.8.

The younger Kennedy finished 90 yards ahead of Ron Delany, Olympic 1500-meter champion at Melbourne last year. Delany was clocked in 24:30, one second ahead of Pete Close of St. John's.

Other top finishers were Don

Luisi of Fordham, 4th in 24:46; Ed Monnelly of Notre Dame, 5th in 24:54; Dave Eckel of Cornell, 6th in 25:00; Bob Lake of Michigan State, 7th in 25:03; and Ben Johns of Syracuse, 10th in 25:08. The Lion freshmen placed third with 73 points behind Syracuse with 52 points and Manhattan with 59 points.

Herm Weber was the first Nittany yearling to finish, placing fifth in 15:00 over the 3-mile course. 3.7 seconds behind individual titlist George Verdisco of Georgetown.

Other Penn State freshman results were: Denny Johnson, 17th in 15:42; Bill Schoenebeck, 20th in 15:27; Ken Hunter, 22nd in 15:29; Dick Anderson, 36th in 15:49; Ron Landon, 49th in 16:06 and Skip Johnston, 69th in 16:43.

silon, took first in diving with 19.4 points.

Harry Calley, Delta Sigma Phi, took first in the 60-yard free style with a :34.6 clocking. Teammate Jim Eastman recorded another first in the 60-yard breast stroke (13.8 points). Teammate Bob Berry in :50.0. Ron Passmore, Delta Sig, was first in diving. Passmore scored 14.6 points.

Bede Bender scored Beaver House's only first by coming

home a victor in the 60-yard back stroke in :53.0. Delta Sig's John Rusnak was a close second in the event.

Delta Sig's relay team of Kolb, Eastman, Passmore and Calley took a first in the event.

Beta Theta Pi also advanced to the semi-finals as a result of their victory. Alpha Chi Rho was the victim, 30-9.

Beta's John Mallory claimed 10 of the victor's 30 points. Mallory came home first in the 60-yard breast stroke in :58.7, and came back to win the 60-yard back stroke with a time of :45.5.
