(Continued from page two) inadequate number of officers to meet national needs are prepared when the basic ROTC work is made optional.

Initial reaction to the proposal came in an editorial in The Daily Collegian. The editorial held the main issue to be not a new program, but "whether students should be required to take ROTC and CD in any form."

The editorial further maintained that students should not be required to take such a program, but that the University should offer the program on a voluntary basis. It said an elective ROTC would not decrease significantly the number of graduating officers and called for the services to do a better selling job to interest students.

The Liberal Arts Student Council took up the cudgel on Tuesday when its members called for rejection of the Senate committee's report, elimination of compulsory ROTC and inclusion of a 1-semester civil defense course in men's and women's required physical education programs.

Robert Nurock, LA Council president, on Thursday took the recommendations to Cabinet for

endorsement by that body. Cabinet, with only four dissenters, voted to postpone discussion and decision on the matter until members have had a chance to investigate and deliberate.

The matter will be taken up again at Cabinet's Dec. 5 meeting.
