

German Minister To Speak at Chapel

The Rev. Eberhard Bethge, a pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Germany, will speak on "The Surety—Jesus" at Chapel services at 10:55 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab Auditorium.

Bethge is serving on the faculty of the Harvard Divinity School as a visiting lecturer in theology.

The Chapel Choir, directed by Willa C. Taylor, will sing "Lo, in the Appointed Time" by William George E. Ceiga. University organist, will play "Fantasia on Veni Emmanuel" by Rowley as the prelude, and "Nun Komm, der Heiden Heiland" and "Fugue in B Minor on a Corelli Theme" by Bach as the offertory and postlude.

Bethge will speak on "An Introduction to Dietrich Vothoefler, Modern Martyr" at the Lutheran Student Association Center at 3 p.m. tomorrow.

Bethge and Vothoefler were members of a conspiracy to kill Hitler during World War II. The attempt failed and the conspirators were sentenced to hang. Vothoefler was executed but the war ended before Bethge was to be hanged.

The Rev. Arthur Ruths, pastor at the Lutheran Student Center, will speak at the University Christian Association Protestant service at 9 a.m. tomorrow in the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Chapel.

The B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation will present the kinescope "Segregation and the South" at 7:30 p.m. tomorrow in the Hillel

auditorium.

The faculty commentator for the film, the fifth in the fall TV Film Forums, will be Dr. Michael Chiappetta, associate professor of education.

The Canterbury Association will meet at 5 p.m. tomorrow in the Parish House of the St. Andrew's Episcopal Church. The Rev. Clarence Reimer of the St. John's Episcopal Church, Bellefonte, will speak on "What Christmas Should Mean to a Churchman."

William Bauer, graduate student in chemistry, will speak on "Our Life" at 6:15 p.m. tomorrow in the Wesley Foundation student center.
