

DU, LCA Boxers Score 4 Wins in IM Action

Lambda Chi Alpha and Delta Upsilon each won two fights to highlight last night's intramural boxing action at Recreation Hall.

On the ten-bout card, Lambda Chi's Don Gray, DU's Joe Riley, Lambda Chi's Dick Wilson, DU's John Rusnak, Pi Kappa Phi's Al Lasko, ZBT's Ted Steinman, Alpha Zeta's Bob McCown and Theta Chi's Dave Frick, won contests in the fraternity division.

Al Sinopoli and Sam Becker copied wins at 155 pounds in the independent class.

Gray used a good second round to defeat Wilbert Hobbs, Sigma Nu, in a 175-pound clash. Although Hobbs was strong with left-hand leads, Gray's two-fisted attack was the more aggressive.

In one of the closest bouts of the night, Riley scored a decision over Pete Moran, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, at 155 pounds. A hard right to Moran's head by Riley in the final round was the decisive blow in the outcome of the match.

Heavy-hitting Wilson scored a decision win over Erich Fichtner, Beta Theta Pi, in the heavy-weight division to give Lambda Chi its second win of the night.

Delta Upsilon's Rushak scored a first round victory over Joseph Hurlburt, Alpha Zeta. Rusnak opened the 175-pound clash with a flurry of right and left hand punches which sent his opponent to the deck.

Pi Kappa Phi's Lasko won a third-round victory over DU's Elliott Silver when referee Frank Patrick stopped the fight. Lasko gained his win in the heavyweight contest by using a combination of punches which kept Silver off balance.

Stineman, another heavyweight boxer, captured a third-round verdict over James Hawley, Alpha Zeta. It was Steinman's solid right-hand punches and constant flurries which proved decisive.

In the other indie bout, Becker scored an easy decision win over Dan Jarosz. Jarosz remained on the defensive during most of the action as Becker banged away with a powerful hitting attack.
