

New Requirements OK'd Installation of Seats Begins in Schwab For Top IFC Positions

The Interfraternity Council last night added to their constitution by a 42-11 vote a clause requiring candidates for IFC president, administrative vice president, and secretary-treasurer to come from a major council position or a house presidency.

Businessmen To Address Career Day

Three Pennsylvania businessmen will speak at the Liberal Arts Career Day at 7 p.m. Thursday in the Hetzel Union Auditorium.

Donald J. Coan of the Joseph Horne Co., Pittsburgh, J. E. Smith of the Armstrong Cork Co. and Harold W. Scott of the First Pennsylvania Banking and Trust Co. will give short talks answering questions about job opportunities for liberal arts students.

They will discuss interviews, effects of military service and marriage on a job and the importance of advanced degrees.

Donald M. Cook, assistant director of the Placement Service, will open the program by explaining the purpose and work of the Placement service.

After a question and answer period, the group will move to the main lounge of the HUB for a coffee hour and informal discussion.

Career Night is sponsored by the Liberal Arts Student Council. Sandra Cusky, junior in journalism from Pittsburgh, is chairman of the career night committee.

Deans to Speak To LA Council

Dean Ben Euwema and Associate Dean Richard C. Maloney of the College of the Liberal Arts will speak to members of the Liberal Arts Student Council at 7 tonight in 214 Hetzel Union.

They will discuss the council's CD-ROTC resolution and report which have been presented to All-University Cabinet.

Council members will discuss the fraternity-independent rotation plan for electing All-U and class officers.

Other business will include the election of a treasurer and a corresponding secretary and the presentation of the final report on LA Career Day, which will be held on Thursday.

The wooden seats in Schwab Auditorium, which have been in use for more than 50 years, are being replaced by upholstered seats.

Workmen moved most of the old seats out of the building yesterday.

The new seats will be arranged to afford the best possible view of the stage, according to Walter N. Wiegand, director of Physical Plant. The rows of seats will include seats of three different widths—19, 20 and 21 inches—to achieve a better arrangement.

A total of 1140 seats will be installed, including 296 in the balcony and 844 on the main floor. This will slightly reduce

the seating capacity of the auditorium, which up to now had 1163 seats.

The auditorium will be redecorated later if funds are available, Wiegand said.

Construction of three small buildings providing facilities for several departments in the College of Agriculture, has been authorized by the executive committee of the Board of Trustees.

One building, approximately 30 feet square, will be constructed adjacent to the present solar poultry house to provide

a workroom for research on the production of quality eggs and to provide housing for special instruments used in measuring the performance of the solar poultry house.

A bull barn, about 100 by 32 feet, will be built at the new Dairy Barn Center, northwest of the present administration building of the center. It will provide safe housing for herd sires.

The other structure will be a poll barn, 30 by 104 feet, which will be built at the Farm Service Center to house beef cattle.

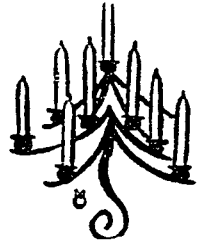

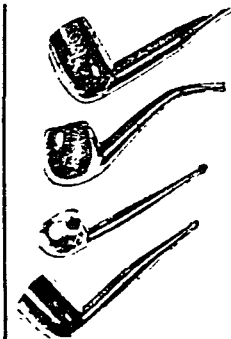

The new eligibility clause includes both present and past holders of the major council positions or house presidencies.

Before last night's constitution change, there were no eligibility requirements for candidates for IFC offices beyond a minimum-scholastic average. The clause was added to "avoid a popularity contest" in IFC elections, Stephen Higgins, secretary-treasurer, said last night.

Higgins further said that he had never been to an IFC meeting before his election to his present office, and that elections such as this cut down on the efficiency of the council because of the time required for a new officer to become oriented to council procedure.

The "major positions" mentioned in the clause, which was changed from the original "major chairmanships" after a controversy at the amendment's initial reading two weeks ago, has been defined as a junior Fraternity Affairs Office secretary position or a major committee chairmanship.

The new amendment reads "To be eligible for the offices of president, administrative vice president, or secretary-treasurer, the candidates must have held or be holding a major position in IFC. Those men who have served or are serving as president of the local chapter of their fraternity are also eligible for the offices mentioned in this section."

In other business, the council voted to take no definite stand on the question of telephone service to residence halls until they had more information. The council had voted two weeks ago to investigate the possibility of having direct phone lines from fraternities to residence halls, at the expense of the fraternities.

A revision of the constitution will be discussed at the Panhellenic Council meeting at 6:30 tonight in 203 Hetzel Union.

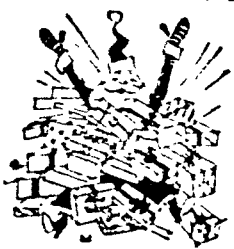
