LA Council Plans Check On Research

The Liberal Arts Student Council has formed a committee to investigate research facilities and to publicize the research done in the LA College.

The council moved for the action after discussing the problem of research including the lack of subsidizations and the small amount of publicity the college's program receives. James Ferraro was appointed chairman of the committee.

To fill two recently created offices, Patricia O'Neill was elected corresponding secretary and Richard Friedman was chosen treasurer.

Judith Stock, council representative to the WSGA "big-little sister" program, asked for council opinion on the proposed plan to have each new freshman woman matched with an upperclassman to improve their orientation. After discussion, it was decided to table the motion for further study.

The council asked president Robert Nurock to tender an invitation to Dean Harold K. Schilling of the Graduate School and chairman of the sub-committee, which drew up the CD-ROTC plan, to speak on the ROTC question.

Nurock appointed Louis Phillips chairman of a "watch-dog" committee on ROTC. Other members are Barbara Stone, Ruth Noble, David Epstein, Patricia Evans and Ronald Weitz.

Medal to Honor Achievements in Higher Ed

The University has established the Penn State Medal to recognize and honor the achievements of persons who have made an outstanding contribution to higher education in Pennsylvania.

The award, authorized by the executive committee of the Board of Trustees, would be bestowed by the president of the University, with the authorization of the Trustees.

Any person who merits the award, except members of the board, would be eligible to receive it. It would be made only when warranted.

The award is planned as a scroll, properly inscribed, citing the achievements for which the recipient was recognized. There also would be a medallion, bearing the University seal on one side, and on the other side the name of the awardee, the date of the award and the statement, "For distinguished service to higher education in Pennsylvania."

Nominations for the award would be made by the president of the University to the Board of Trustees.

Metzger Honored By Pershing Rifles

The outstanding pledge medal of Company B of the Fifth Regiment Pershing Rifles has been awarded to Warren Metzger, freshman in mechanical engineering from Shaker Heights, Ohio.

Linda Quinn, junior from Maplewood, N.J., was named company queen and was given honorary captain's bars. Her picture will be submitted to the Fifth Regimental Headquarters in competition to select a regimental queen. The University company will be her sponsor.

Loan Fund Set Up By Class of 1917

The class of 1917 has established a student loan fund.

The money for the loans will come from gifts of members of the class, from repayment of the loans already made and from the interest collected on them.

The interest will be payable at a progressive rate, two per cent for the first year, four per cent for the second and six per cent for successive years, after the student leaves the University.
