IBM Donates Magnetic Drum

A new \$25,000 magnetic drum has been donated to the Com-puter Laboratory by the Inter-national Business Machines Corporation to replace the drum which the firm gave the University two years ago.

The magnetic drum is used in the digital computer to store 11decimal digit numbers and instructions.

It is capable of storing 2500 of these quantities at one time. The drum rotates at 12,600 revolutions per minute and the average waiting time for a number after it is called for is reported to be 2.4 thousandths of a second.
