

## Morini to Present Tartini Compositions

Two compositions by the distinguished Italian violinist, Giuseppe Tartini, will be included on the program, the eighth of the Artists' Series, to be presented by Erica Morini at 8:30 tonight in Schwab Auditorium.

Miss Morini, recognized as one of the great violinists of the present day, will open with Sonata in G minor and Variations on a Theme by Corelli, both by Tartini.

She will continue with Mozart's Sonata No. 15 in B flat major,

K. 454, and following the intermission will play Sonata No. 3 in E flat major, Opus 12, No. 3 by Beethoven.

The concluding numbers on the program will be Habanera by Ravel; and Valse Caprice and Souvenir de Moscou, both by the Polish violinist, Henri Wieniawski.

Miss Morini will be accompanied at the piano by Leon Pommers.

More than 200 tickets are still available at the Hetzel Union desk. Students may obtain tickets without charge and non-students may purchase tickets for \$1.25.

## Town Parking Plan Hits \$1750 Snag

A difference of opinion—the tune of slightly more than \$1750—has caused a change in tactics by the State College Parking Authority in their program for a half million dollar downtown municipal parking lot.

The \$1750 is the difference between the price the authority wants to pay and the price the landowner has set for the property at 118 W. Beaver Ave., one of the proposed sites for the new parking lot. The issue has led the authority to investigate the legal procedures of condemnation, although they have not officially started any proceedings.

The property, adjoining the lot at 112 W. Beaver Ave. which the authority has purchased for \$50,000, is owned by Morris Fromm, of State College. Fromm's final sale price is set at \$46,153.44.

The final purchase price decided upon by the authority is \$44,400. The authority has voted unanimously to reject Fromm's offer and to instruct its solicitor to investigate the procedures of condemnation.

The price the Authority offered for the property was based on findings of a board of appraisers, made up of eight State College real estate agents who surveyed and evaluated each property to be involved in the parking lots.

A board statement accompanying the price recommendation said: "We believed the price is substantial and in accordance with the current real estate market in State College."

There are two other proposed sites for the parking lot besides the one on West Beaver: one at

210-214 and 216 West College Ave.; and one between West Beaver and Calder Alley, bordering on South Frazier Street.

Negotiations are continuing for the third lot involved in the West Beaver Ave. proposal, owned by the Centre County Film Lab, which adjoins the Fromm property now under consideration.

It is expected that the negotiations for all the properties involved in the parking plans will be completed by March 1 after which the Authority will float an estimated \$350,000 bond issue.
