IE Group Given National Award

The University chapter of Alpha Pi Mu, industrial engineering honorary society, has been designated the outstanding chapter of the year by the national headquarters of the society.

In recognition of the honor, the chapter was presented a trophy cup. Since it is the third successive year that the chapter has been so designated, it gains permanent possession of the trophy.

The chapter will be host to the national convention April 19 and 20.

The reason given at the time for the proposed rule change was the incentive it might give fraternities to enter the contest, which has been suffering in recent years from a decrease in participants. A vote on the proposal is scheduled for the next IFC meeting Monday night.
