

Hager Will Direct Adult Ed Program

Dr. Cyril F. Hager has been appointed director of the project in liberal education for adults.

The project, which was announced earlier this week, is designed to make available throughout the state adult education programs in four areas of study—humanities, social sciences, the arts and group discussion leadership.

Hager also was appointed professor of speech and social science. Both appointments are effective May 1.

Hager has been with the Foreign Service Institute of the State Department since 1956, serving as assistant director of the educational planning staff and heading the senior officers' course.

As director of the project Hager will head a staff of four specialists, one for each area of study. He will be responsible to the policy committee composed of Lawrence E. Dennis, vice president for academic affairs; Edward L. Keller, director of general extension, and Ben Euwema, dean of the College of the Liberal Arts.

He is one of three authors of the book "The New Training for Effective Speech." The other authors are Dr. Robert T. Oliver, head of the department of speech, and R. L. Cortright.

Hager is a member of the American Academy of Political and Social Science and the Speech Association of America.
