

Open Houses Mark Beginning Of Formal Rushing for Coeds

Chatter Dates Beain Monday

Open houses in all sorority suites from 1:30 to 5 p.m. tomorrow and 1:30 to 5 p.m. and 6:30 to 8 p.m. Sunday will provide coeds with their first sample of the varied events scheduled for the formal rush program.

All rushees may attend open houses without invitation. Afternoon dresses or suits, stockings, heels and gloves will be worn.

The schedule for open houses is as follows:

Rushees whose last names fall between A and L may visit the suites of group A: Alpha Gamma Delta, Alpha Kappa Alpha, Alpha Omicron Pi, Beta Sigma Omicron, Chi Omega, Gamma Phi Beta, Kappa Alpha Theta, Pi Beta Phi, Phi Mu, Pyrose, Sigma Delta Tau and Theta Phi Alpha.

Rushees whose last names begin with M through Z may attend open house in the suites of group B: Alpha Chi Omega, Alpha Epsilon Phi, Alpha Xi Delta, Delta Delta Delta, Delta Gamma, Delta Zeta, Kappa Delta, Kappa Kappa Gamma, Phi Sigma Sigma, Sigma Sigma Sigma, Alpha Phi and Zeta Tau Alpha.

On Sunday all rushees whose last names fall between M and Z may visit the suites of group A and those whose names begin with A through L may attend open house in the group B suites.

Each rushee may stay no longer than 30 minutes at any one sorority nor revisit the same sorority, except those women visiting Alpha Kappa Alpha, Alpha Epsilon Phi, Phi Sigma Sigma and Sigma Delta Tau who may spend one hour at each suite if they wish.

Invitations to the first round of chatter dates Monday and Tuesday will be issued from 10:30 to 11:45 a.m. Monday in the Panhellenic post office.

Each rushee may accept as many as ten invitations during the first round of chatter dates.

A semi-strict silence period will be in effect from the time of open house until the signing of preference cards. According to the Panhellenic rushing code no affiliated woman may talk about sororities or rushing during this period. Other contacts forbidden between Greeks and rushees are personal notes and telephone calls, "coke dates," and gatherings in any residence hall room other than chapter rooms.
