(Continued from page one) to complete registration at another meeting and switched parties, he would take the matter to the dean of men's office. The meeting resumed at 9:15 in the other elections. Charles Welch defeated Bernard Brown 83-69 for vice chairman; Barbara Kohler defeated Patricia Niedbala 89-82 for executive secretary, and Barbara Facinelli defeated Janet Stanke 115-30 for corresponding secretary.

In a statement last night, Dr. Angelo said, "The goal of our party, which is more representative student government, was strengthened. The vote indicated

that the students are behind University Party and that it is actually controlled by them. Pfautz said, "It was a wide-open meeting... I am interested in the new party as much as anyone else... according to the vote the people chose the man whom they thought will guide the party along the right lines."
