

University Has 2nd Temp Building

The University may well dedicate a Temporary Building Annex soon—one which undoubtedly will be torn down in 2000 A.D. with the other "temporary" building.

Another name for the new building—some refer to it as the old green shack next to Boucke—has been suggested as the Temporary Borrow and Build Branch Building.

This, of course, refers to the General State Authority which has been using the structure as headquarters for campus GSA construction work.

Previously the structure was used during construction of Boucke Building.

The building is now vacant, awaiting start of work on the proposed home economics building, the engineering building and petroleum technology laboratory along College Avenue. Each building will be built by the General State Authority.

Meanwhile several minor projects are under way in existing buildings.

Charles A. Lamm, head of the division of building and maintenance and operation, said several classrooms on the first and second floors of Sparks Building are being converted into offices. The Department of Sociology will occupy a part of the new offices.

The project was begun about two weeks ago and will not be finished for some time.

University workmen are painting the interiors of Willard and Weaver Halls. Two other painting projects are scheduled for the interiors of Temporary Building and Armsby Hall.

Landscape work has been at a standstill since the cold weather has set in.

Walter W. Trainer, head of the division of landscape construction and maintenance, said his office now is planning work for the spring.

Trainer said grading and grass planting is planned for the new women's dormitory area and also at the sewage plant. Since only about six weeks of working time will be available in the spring, Trainer said the project may have to be continued until next fall.

John Lawlor, B.S. in E.E., Brown, '52, answers some questions about
