"You know, last March we floated a bond issue for \$22 million (for new dormitories and dining rooms) We will pay off that bond issue from the rents and board fees we get from students. And lovers from now the University—and this means the state—will own those dormitories . .", Dr. We'ker said.

The implication that any Uni-

The implication that any University property is also owned by the state is clearly put. Comparable situations of ownership are found at almost all other state universities.

This is how the University escaped the right-to-know laws passed by the state. By taking advantage of its Dr. Jekvll-Mr. Hyde standing, the Board of Trustees avoided the possibility of having to open its meetings to the public, even though the University President has strongly implied that the University is, in reality, a state institution.
