

Panhel Votes Song Switch For Winners

Panhel Council has voted to require the first, second and third place winners in the IFC Panhel sing to change their sorority song in next year's contest.

Contrary to the Interfraternity Council's ruling on this year's sing, the Panhel ruling will not be in effect until next year.

Several Panhel members Tuesday night considered it unfair to make a ruling concerning songs this late in the semester, as some sororities have been practicing since last semester.

Panhel also voted to have informal rushing from March 10 to 21. Freshmen with a 2.3 average and upperclasswomen with a 2.0 All-University average may register for informal rush in the dean of women's office until March 7.

Coeds who registered for formal rushing and did not pledge a sorority may also rush, but need not re-register. A list of these women will be available for sororities in the dean's office.

Invitations to rush will be extended from the sororities to the rushees by telephone.

Sororities not wishing to rush informally should notify Mrs. R. Mae Schultz, assistant to the dean of women, in writing.

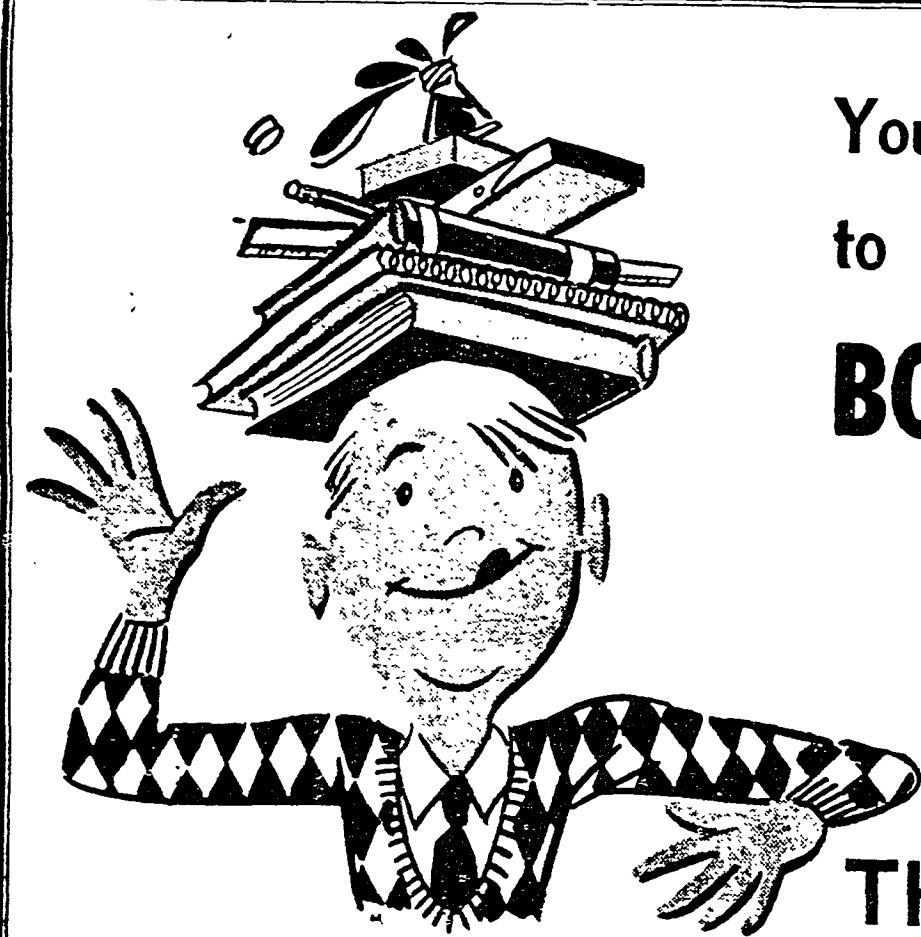
