

### Fall Field Day May Replace Ag Open House

The Agricultural Council is considering holding an Agricultural Field Day in the fall to replace the fall Ag Open House which was designed to demonstrate the University Agriculture program to high school seniors.

Donald Gould, junior in animal husbandry from North Wales, suggested that the Field Day should have such contests as calf roping, tractor driving and cow milking and that the program should be held in conjunction with the Dairy Exposition.
