

Annual Drawing Research-- For Exposition Set for Tonight

The Block and Bridle Club will hold its annual drawing for the 41st Little International Livestock Exposition at 7:30 tonight in 208 Armsby.

Show Manager Richard Fowler said no experience is necessary to enter the show and fitting and showing demonstrations will be given later for the benefit of the contestants.

Each person will draw a number which represents a certain sheep, horse, pig or cow. It will be the student's responsibility to train and groom these animals for showing at the exposition to be held April 26 at the University.

Breed managers for the Little International reported that the beef cattle division will include heifer and steer classes of the Hereford, Angus and Shorthorn breeds.

The Hampshire, Southdown, Dorset, Shropshire and Cheviot breeds will be represented in the sheep division.

Hampshire, Berkshire, Yorkshire, Duroc and one class of crossbreeds will make up the swine division and there will be one class of horses.

Trophies and ribbons will be awarded to the winners in each division.

sum required to finance one full-time research worker, the 549 equivalent man-years available means that \$10 million more could be spent before our leading colleges reach their full engineering research potential." Ramsey points out in a project progress report.

In recommendations to Dr. James R. Killian Jr., the President's adviser on science and technology, the committee said "the support of basic research in engineering and the form in which it is offered are of the utmost importance to the nation."

Because research is the "most essential and costly component of advanced education," the report said, "research support determines not only the amount of research accomplished but also the supply of individuals with the background necessary to teach engineering in an age when basic understanding of scientific principles must replace dependence on intuition and experience."

To strengthen engineering college research, the committee recommended a five point program: to increase the number and amount of basic research contracts with universities; to encourage the participation of graduate students in basic research projects; to make sure that universities are fully compensated for indirect as well as direct costs of research; to provide federal funds for build-

ing or enlarging universities' facilities for fundamental engineering research.

The committee also recommended provision for long-term basic research contracts with universities "so that areas of competence may be developed and supported without straining educational resources through contact instability."
