

LA Council Drops Plans For Banquet

Robert Charles, acting as president to make a tie, made the vote on the banquet 11 to 11. When a new motion was made, the banquet was automatically dropped.

The banquet had been planned at the last meeting for the council members and distinguished members of the liberal arts faculty, but a vote on the cost was tabled until prices could be investigated.

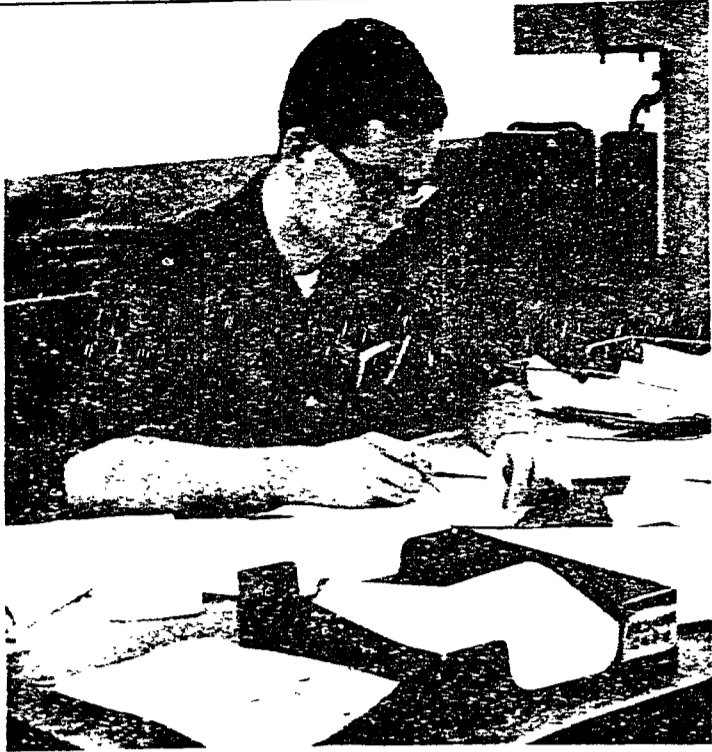
The council voted to establish two \$150 scholarships, one to be paid from this council's treasury and one from the next council's treasury. The council originally had provided for one \$100 scholarship.

The motion was approved 14 to 9 after council members objected to earmarking the next council's funds since this might hamper other plans of the council.

The council also voted to recommend to its successor that it investigate the possibility of instituting an honor system in the College of the Liberal Arts.

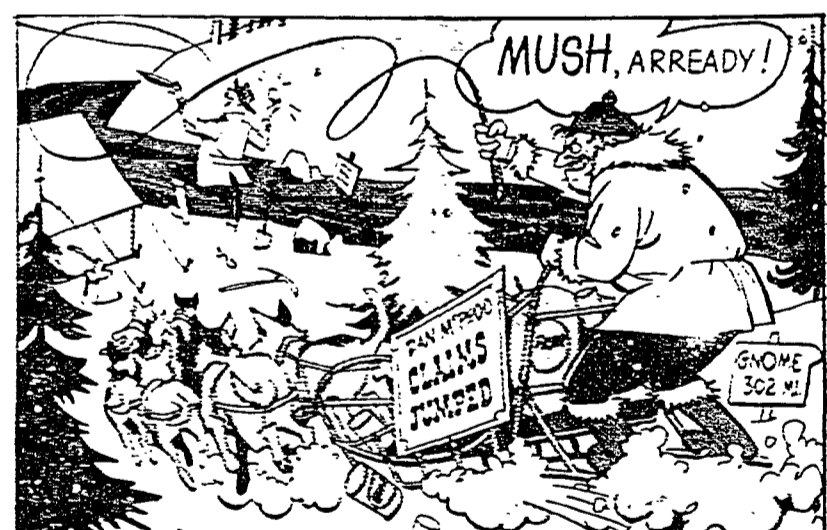
