

Bermuda Ban Lifted For Final Weeks

Women students may wear bermuda shorts and kilts in the dining rooms during the weeks of final examinations for all meals except the Sunday noon meal, according to a revision in regulations made by the Women's Student Government Association Wednesday night.

Bermuda shorts may also be worn to class as long as the professor does not object.

The previous ruling stated that bermuda shorts and kilts could never be worn in the dining rooms. The new revision, however, does not change the rule that they may not be worn in dormitory lounges or in administrative offices.

Bermudas are permitted in the recreation rooms of the dormitories and going through the lobbies.

This and other revisions in rules made by WSGA Senate will go into effect April 9. A "Standards of Conduct" list has been compiled that will supplement the present rules and regulations.

WSGA officials hope by this standards of conduct to "help women develop personal responsibility and independent thinking."

Other revisions in regulations state that upperclasswomen need only to sign out for Friday and Saturday nights if they are going to be out after 10 p.m. Freshmen must now sign out by 6:30 p.m. instead of the previous noontime.

Women students are permitted four 1 a.m. traveling permissions each semester. Under the previous ruling women were allowed three 1 a.m.'s.

Robert E. Galbraith, Fulbright adviser on campus, said there are also some openings in the interim programs for 1958 through 1959 in Brazil, Iran, Ireland and Taiwan.

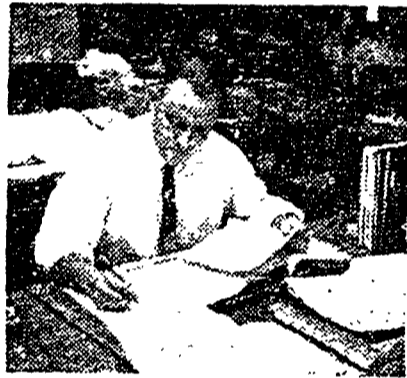

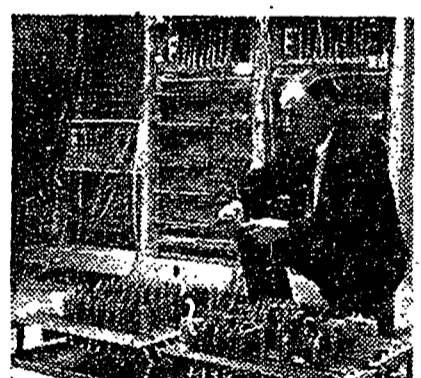
