Encampment Applications Available

Students interested in attending the 1958-59 Student Encampment may pick up applications today through next Wednesday at the Hetzel Union desk.

The Cabinet Personnel Interviewing Committee will interview applicants on May 4, 5 and 6.

Encampment, which has been in existence for six years, is a 3-day conference held before the start of school in September. Problems of the students and the University are discussed and resulting recommendations are made to the All-University Cabinet during the following fall semester.

Ninety students will attend this year's Encampment, which will be held September 4 through 7 at the Mont Alto School of Forestry. Of these 90 students, about 70 will be chosen by the positions they hold in campus activities.

The remaining 20 will be chosen from the applicants on the basis of their interviews, and, in some cases, campus activities.

While Encampment does not constitute a legislative body, its recommendations to Cabinet appear to have had a great deal of success, and have exerted much influence in the past.

Much of the student insurance program instituted this year grew out of Encampment recommendations.

Abolition of the rotation system also grew out of an Encampment recommendation, as did the Cabinet reorganization which is now in a Cabinet committee for study.

The work of Encampment is done in seven or eight special workshops, followed by a plenary session at the end of the 3-day conference.

The coeds will be interviewed singly on stage by master of ceremonies Stewart Kahan, president of Thespians. Judges Luther Kepler, Bill Coleman and Robert Breon, local photographers, will be seated in the audience.

The winner will be crowned by James Jimirro, spring week chairman, after a medley of four numbers is played in the style of Billy May by the Phi Mu Alpha Band.

The Axidentals, A B C - Paramount recording artists, will present a 45-minute concert. The group was voted the most promising vocal group in the Billboard Tenth Annual Disc-Jockey Poll.

Billed as the group with the "well-integrated sound," the four Axidentals have appeared at the Copacabana in New York City, the El Cortez Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada, and the Copa Club in Pittsburgh.

After their concert, the group will announce the overall winners of Spring Week. The names of winners will be placed in sealed envelopes and remain secret until the envelopes are opened by the Axidentals.

The 26 trophies and 4 medals to be awarded will be on display this week and next in the Athletic Store.

Representatives of the University will include Elizabeth Harned, poetry; Floyd Santoro, prose; Frank Cermak, drama; and Kenneth Williams, who will participate in the reading hour Thursday night.

Dr. Charlotte I. Lee, associate professor of speech at Northwestern University, will speak on "Anyone We Know?" a collection of character sketches by contemporary authors, at the banquet at 5:45 p.m. tomorrow in the Hetzel Union Building.

Since the festival is not a contest there will be no judging or rating. However, after each of the sessions devoted exclusively to the reading of a particular form of literature, Dr. Lee will discuss the criteria for interpreting that form.

Englishman Will Speak On Science

Dr. Charles E. Raven, personal chaplain to Queen Elizabeth, will speak on "Recent Changes in the Relation Between Religion and Science" at 8 p.m. tomorrow in 121 Sparks.

Dr. Raven, former vice chancellor of Cambridge University, is a canon in the Church of England. He is the author of many biological works.

Dr. Raven delivered the Gifford lectures at St. Andrews which have been published in two volumes entitled "Science and Religion" and "Experience and Interpretation." He is also the author of "Science and the Christian Man."

Dr. Raven has been giving a series of lectures at the University of Cincinnati's College of Medicine which are designed to help students understand the historical and philosophical complications of the medical profession.

He will be accompanied by his wife, Mrs. Raven, who served in the Belgian Resistance movement during World War II, also is a distinguished lecturer.

The lecture is sponsored by the faculty committee on religious studies of the College of the Liberal Arts. Immediately following the lecture there will be a public reception for Dr. and Mrs. Raven in the Hetzel Union Building.

'European Thinking' To Be Discussed

The Rev. Eberhard Bethge, an anti-Nazi involved in the Hitler assassination attempt July 20, 1944, and Mrs. Charles E. Raven, Belgian underground resistance leader during World War II, will discuss "Contemporary Thinking in Europe" at 7:30 tonight in the memorial lounge of the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Chapel.

The forum is sponsored by World University Service, currently conducting a campus-wide drive.
