He added, "If we insist on having courses in citizenship or survival training, then we should also make driver training compulsory—or better yet, marriage survival, something everyone should know."

Dr. Harry L. Krall, professor of mathematics, in one blunt summary question asked, "Is ROTC worth academic credit?"

Dr. Franklin B. Krauss, professor of Latin, said, "None of the other colleges at the Senate meeting wanted the ROTC program. This is not in character." If something is good, he continued, the other colleges want it and fight for it.

"The military seems flabbergasted at our invitation to be part of the college—and they must be diplomatic about it," he said.
