(Continued from page one) populations," he said, "and students trained for their futures in a large school are better equipped to handle their problems when they leave Penn State."

Although Walker felt the University's continued growth would not eliminate a "school personality, intimacy and esprit de corps." "We had a personality with 6000 students, we have one now, and there is no reason to believe that we don't have one with 25,000 students," he said.

"Our size is not a liability, except to those students who want a smaller school," Prexy said. "Those students are better off at smaller schools." He said a few alumni have criticized the University's continued expansion, but later they have admitted that "Penn State is a better school for it."

On a different subject, Walker was asked if he thought the Board of Trustee meetings should be opened to the public. He declined to give a "professional opinion" saying "I'm only the secretary of the board and I never vote on this type of issue."

"These men get little prestige and no pay for their job. They work long and hard as Trustees, even though they didn't ask for the job. I don't feel it's my place to try to tell them what to do with their own meetings."

# Laboratories Will Be Shown At Chem-Phys Open House

The laboratories and buildings of the College of Chemistry and Physics will be open to visitors today as part of the college's 1958 Open House, sponsored by the student council of the college.

The most powerful microscope in the world and the quietest room in Centre County are among the more than 25 laboratory displays open to the public.

Guided tours of the buildings and laboratories will be conducted every half hour between 1 and 5 p.m. Members of the student affiliate chapters of the ACS and AICHE, and members of the various honorary organizations will act as guides for the tours which will be conducted for chemistry, chemical engineering, physics and pre-medicine.

Throughout the early afternoon, lectures will be given by students and faculty of the department in 119 Osmond. Robert Black will demonstrate explosions, noises and "spectacular things," in his talk, "Chemical Black Magic."

Dr. Kenneth Manning will perform demonstrations that illustrate the basic principles of physics. Some of the more interesting effects of high voltage will be shown along with experiments involving spinning students and dropping dolls.

Dr. Mary Willard will explain some of her work in a lecture on "Chemistry and Crime Detection." Dr. Willard is a nationally known expert in such fields as detection of poisons and other applications of chemistry to criminology.

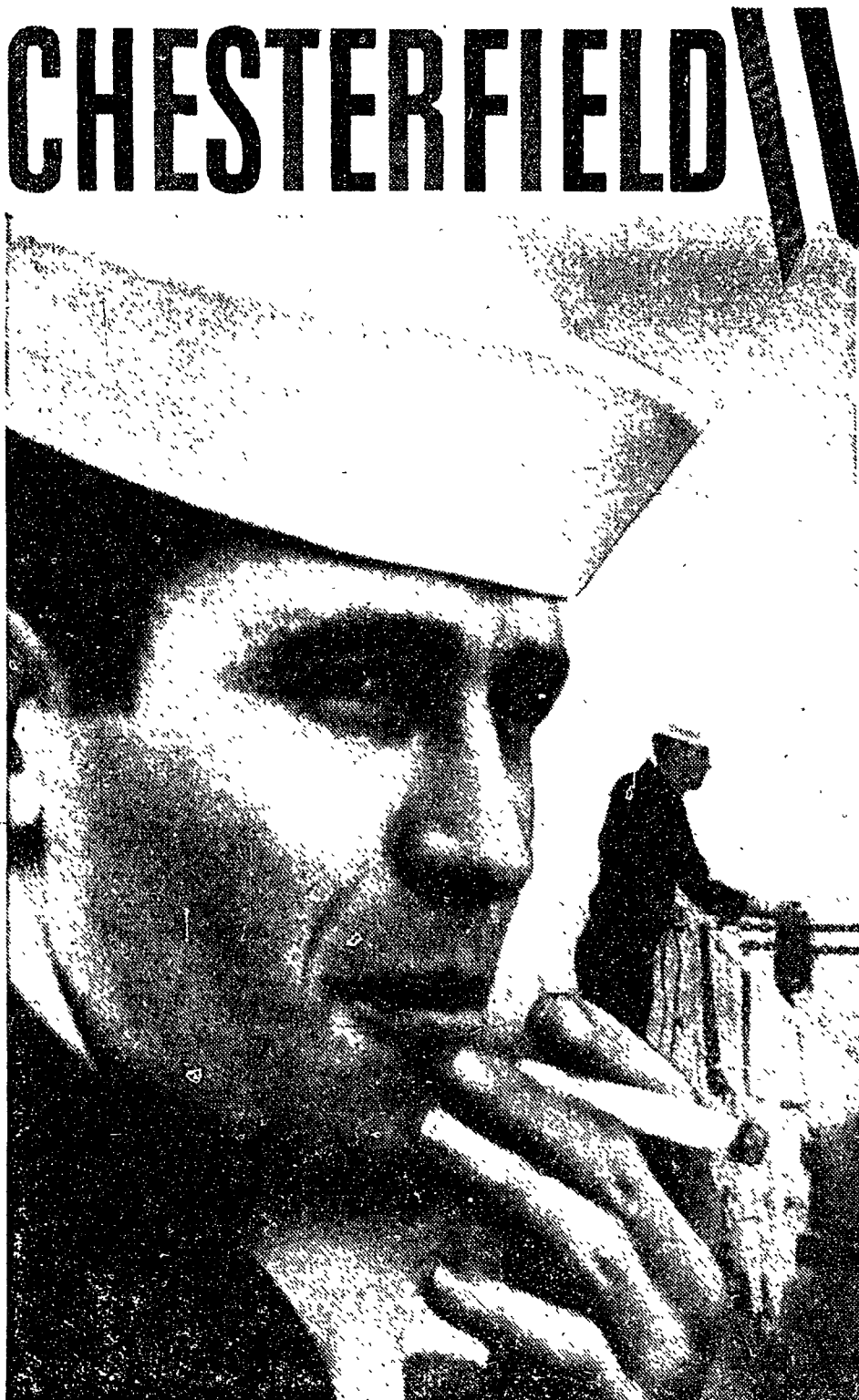
