Eisenhower set forth this double appeal in a new message released at his vacation headquarters, Georgia, a few hours before he flew back to the White House.

The 500-word Eisenhower let ter went to the Kremlin only six days after Khrushchev had fired off a letter 10 times as long to the White House demanding agreement on Soviet disarmament proposals.

The swift Eisenhower reply. the latest move in their con-tinuing public letter writing campaign, reflected the White House decision to answer more quickly to blunt Russian propaganda. Moscow advisers said there was no immediate reaction from the Kremlin.

In his message last Tuesday, Khrushchev had urged Eisenhower to halt all atomic-hydrogen tests immediately without divising any specific East-West inspec-tion plan. He also denounced flights of American atomic bombers in the north on the ground they might trigger off a world catastrophe.
