Public Understanding Asked by Walker

Public understanding is the key to the solution of our education problems, President Eric A. Walker told the Citizen's Committee on Public Education Saturday in Philadelphia.

"If our people understand, our people will act, and only the most concerted, the most dedicated, and the most persistent public action can meet the broad challenge of the scientific age," Walker said.

Walker warned that Russia is seeking to undermine our economic and political leadership.

He said "If our main defense in this cold war is to build up our military strength, we will surely wake up one day to find that Russia has won the scientific, economic and political victory while we were busy preparing for the hot war she carefully avoided."

Evaluating the nation's educational system, Prexy said: "The United States, which led the way in making a secondary education available to every child, must

now make its school system meet mid-20th century requirements.

"Our elementary and high schools are doing a better job than many people give them credit for doing, but they are not fully prepared for the challenge of the future.

"Our colleges have a task ahead of them that they are not equipped to handle. Brainpower has become our most precious resource. We cannot afford to handicap ourselves by failing to develop our supply of it to its full potential."
