

UCA Plans Two Trips To Europe

Two European Seminars — one emphasizing political, educational and religious patterns and the other, art and architecture—will be sponsored by the University Christian Association this summer.

Both seminars will leave July 8 from New York by plane and arrive July 9 in London. The cost of each seminar is \$995, which includes transportation, accommodations, all meals and tips (except for porters, etc.), but does not cover insurance, gifts or beverages.

The Introduction to Europe Seminar will be primarily devoted to looking into the religious, political and economic backgrounds of the eight countries visited: England, Germany, Yugoslavia, Italy, Switzerland, France, Belgium and Holland.

The group will meet leading European figures as well as students from Cambridge University. The tour is under the direction of Dr. Howard A. Cutler, Head of the Department of Economics and Coordinator for General Education.

The Perspectives on Art and Architecture Seminar, under the leadership of Mr. A. William Hajar, professor of Architecture, will place more emphasis on the arts. A four day stay in Brussels for the World's Fair will be included in the tour.

Also included in the seminar are a visit to the Louvre in Paris, a tour of Rome and Florence in Italy, the British Museum in London and a trip through the East Sector of Berlin. The group will visit six countries: England, Germany, Italy, France, Holland and Belgium.

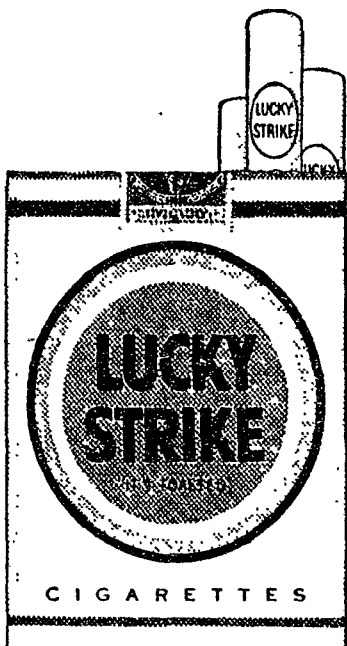
