 Kerr, Englebrink and King finished in a dead heat for first place honors in the Navy meet.
 Moran and Clem Schoenebeck replaced King and Kerr at West Virginia and again the Lions swept the event. Moran snapped the tape in a speedy 4:15.1 to claim first place laurels. Englebrink finished second and Schoenebeck, who is out for the sea-

son due to a pulled muscle, finished third.
 Kerr, Engelbrink and Moran accounted for Penn State's slam

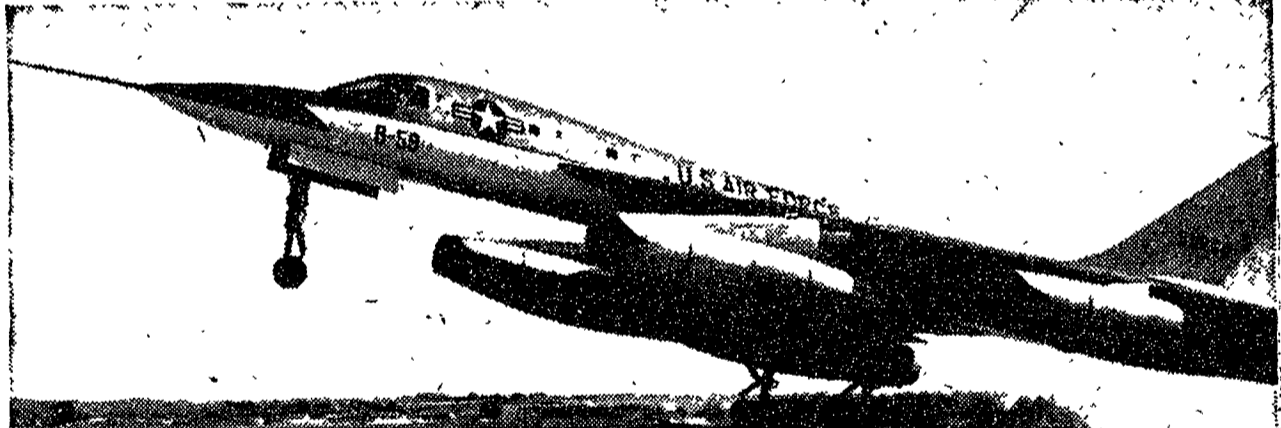

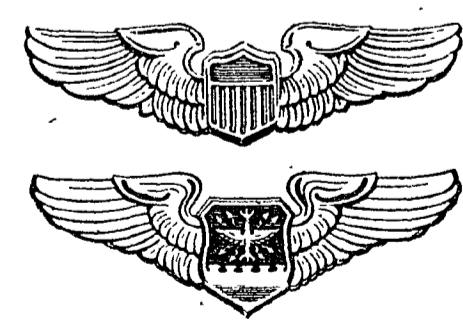
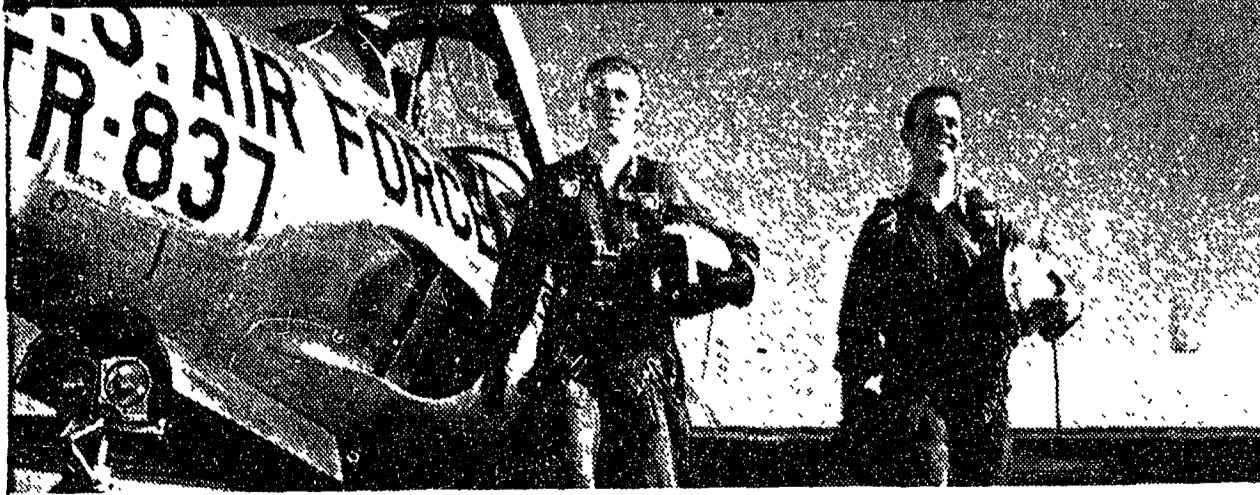
