The award, established by the Board of Trustees, is intended to recognize and honor the achievements of persons who have made an outstanding contribution to higher education in Pennsylvania.

Dr. Sutherland was graduated from Radelife in 1899, taught English and logic at Bradford Academy in Massachusetts and joined the faculty of the Ogontz School in 1902 as a teacher of Scho English. In 1909 she became principal and then purchased the school.

On the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Ogontz School, in 1950, the Board of Trustees, of which Dr. Sutherland was president, presented the grounds, buildings and li-brary to the University for use
