## Students, Profs Tour Canada

Seventeen students and three faculty members from the College of Mineral Industries are taking a two week field trip to Canada.

Under the direction of Dr. Howard L. Hartman, head of the department of mining, William H. Lane, graduate assistant, and David E. Snell, museum curator, junior and senior students in mining engineering will inspect the principal mines of Ontario and Quebec as part of the course requirements of Mining 40. They will return a week from tomorrow.

The operations to be visited include International Nickel and Falconbridge nickel mines at Sudbury, Pronto uranium mine at Blind River, Kerr-Addison gold mine at Kirkland Lake, Noranda copper mine at Rouyn, East Malartic gold mine at Malartic, Lamaque gold mine at Bourlamaque, and Canadian Refractories magnesite mine at Kilmar.

## Visiting Gottingen Prof Gets Ceramics Post

Dr. Hildegard Hoss, of the University of Gottingen, has been named visiting research associate of solid state technology, effective Oct. 1.

She attended schools in London and at Freiberg, Germany, and studied mineralogy and geology at the Universities of Freiberg and Gottingen. At the University, she will

work under the general direction of Dr. George W. Brindley, head of the Department of Ceramic Technology and professor of solid state technology, studying the low-temperature alteration of minerals in relation to clays.

The All-Faith Chapel is a modified Georgian structure with two units. It has a small Meditation Chapel which seats approximately 140 and is used for small services, meditation and weddings. The adjoining Religious Program Center has lounges, meeting rooms, headquarters for each of the individual religious traditions and the chaplain's offices.

An oil portrait of Mrs. Eisenhower, who died at her campus residence on July 10, 1954, hangs in the Memorial Lounge of the building. It is the work of the Norwegian-born Bjorne Egeli.

Sybil D. Emerson, professor of art education, designed the dossier.

Since the chapel is being used by all faiths, the design of the dossier is abstract. It has no symbolism that might be associated with any particular faith. Each person looking at it is expected to read his own interpretation into it.

Gifts from alumni, students, and friends of the University have made the building possible. Further additions will be made to the chapel as soon as additional funds become available.
