

Class Boards Study Asked by Workshop

The Student Encampment Workshop on Subsidiary Organizations of Student Government included in its report a recommendation that a study be made of the function and need of class advisory boards.

Workshop chairman Samuel Fleming said his group expressed dissatisfaction with the present operation of the boards, which were created as an aid to the class officers.

At the Encampment plenary session the following recommendation was added to the report: "Cabinet should set up a system for committees whereby the committees would have to report at regular intervals to Cabinet. The intervals would vary with the committee as determined by Cabinet."

This recommendation was proposed as a method for Cabinet to check the effectiveness of its committees.

The workshop, in discussing the Intercollege Council Board, concluded that the board needs a better definition of its functions. Resulting recommendations were that:

●ICCB thoroughly define its function and then exercise the control necessary to regulate various activities of student councils as they affect the University as a whole.

●ICCB draw up a new constitution and that each college council constitution be modified so that it will not conflict.

●The Division of Counseling Student Council become a full member of ICCB and that ICCB help the new council in whatever way it can.
