

Cabinet May Act On Traffic Relief

All-University Cabinet tonight is expected to start action on trying to alleviate the traffic congestion on College Avenue during the morning, noon and evening rushes.

The Cabinet Executive Committee will recommend that traffic lights be placed at the Locust and Pugh Streets intersections with College Avenue.

Cabinet will meet at 8 p.m. in 203 Hetzel Union.

John Gingrich, All-University secretary-treasurer, said a town affairs committee, headed by John Yoesock, will begin a study of the proposed traffic signals.

Since College Avenue is a state highway, Gingrich said, approval would be required from the state before such signals could be installed.

"It would take some time to get such approval," Gingrich said, "but we want to get the action started."

In other action, Cabinet will hear a recommendation to make a formal bid to include a floating half-holiday in the 1959-60 calendar.

John Bott, student member of the University Senate calendar committee, will report to Cabinet on the half-holiday action.

Bott and Patricia O'Neill requested the floating holiday at a Senate committee meeting earlier this week. The committee asked that any request be made through Cabinet to the administration.

Other committee reports will be presented: Orientation Week, by Ruth Johnson; Student Encampment, Eugene Curry; and Leadership Training program, James Elliott.

The Mall bulletin board and Encampment Reorganization of Student Government Workshop are also scheduled for discussion.

Guest Prof To Address Grad School

V. A. Rice, professor emeritus and former dean of the School of Agriculture, Massachusetts State College, will be guest speaker at the annual convocation of the Graduate School at 7:30 tonight in Schwab Auditorium.

Rice will discuss "Our Growing Challenge."

During the intermission, the election of college representatives to the Graduate Student Association Council will be concluded. An informal dance and mixer will be held in the ballroom of the Hetzel Union Building immediately after the convocation.

Dr. Luther Harshbarger, University chaplain, will give the invocation. President Eric A. Walker will give a brief welcome.

Dr. Harold K. Schilling, dean of the Graduate School, will welcome faculty and students to the school.

Overhauled Judicial System Proposed

A new, coordinated student judicial system which could expand to accommodate a much larger enrollment was proposed at Student Encampment.

The recommended system organizes the present judicial bodies into a structure headed by the Senate Committee on Student Affairs as the final appeal group.

The new structure was suggested at Encampment by the Judicial Workshop, headed by Mary Ann Gemmill. The Encampment plenary session approved the proposal, and it will be taken before All-University Cabinet this fall.

The recommended judicial system would include two main units—one to hear cases involving groups and the other for cases concerning individual students.

The Senate sub-committee on organizational control would serve as the appeal body for group cases. The cases would be heard first by one of three student courts:

The Interfraternity Council Board of Control, the Panhellenic Board of Control or the Organizational Board of Control.

The organizational board

would have jurisdiction over all University organizations except social fraternities and sororities.

An amendment to the report passed at the plenary session provides for division of the board. It states:

"If any organization finds a need for its own board of control equal to that of Panhel or IFC, the board shall be established separately from the Organizational Board of Control."

The chairman of each board of control would become a permanent member of the Senate sub-committee. The three chairmen would serve as the Council of Organizational Chairmen, acting in a coordinating capacity to the judicial groups, keeping records and attempting to provide conformity and unity of policy and procedure from year to year.

The appeal body for judicial cases involving individual students would be the Senate sub-committee on discipline.

Courts under the sub-committee would be traffic court, women's judicial, campus men's tribunals and off-campus men's tribunals.

Women's judicial would act as a board of appeal for standards committees set up within the residence halls, hearing all appeals and those cases for which a standard penalty is not

prescribed.

Campus men's tribunals would include groups from the East Hall, West Halls, North Halls and others established in the future.

As many off-campus men's tribunals as needed would be established.

The chairmen of the main courts would become permanent members of the Senate sub-committee on discipline. They would comprise the Council of Disciplinary Chairmen.
