HomeEc Additions Soon to Be Enclosed

Workmen should beat the bad weather in enclosing the south and office wings of the Home Economics Building, Wink Miller, superintendent of the project, said.

"The project is moving right along and work on the buildings should be done before the April, 1960, target date," Miller said.

The wooden frames on the second floor are now under construction on the south wing that faces College Avenue. The stone foundation for the office wing is also complete. The two wings connect with the old south wing.

The old south wing, which has been partially demolished, will be incorporated into the new system. It has been torn down as far as it will go, according to Miller, and it will receive a new stone front.

Other phases of the home economics rebuilding program include a steam tunnel connecting the new buildings with the main Home Economics Building along

the south mall and a north wing, which will be added to the old south wing.

The north wing will be a 3-story building. At present, the foundations of the building have been laid. Forms are now being made for the building's walls.

Excavation is the only other work being done on the project now.

Miller said that tentative plans call for the crews to work all winter. However, he said that there is a question if this will be possible.

Earl Cump from Chambersburg is the contractor for the project. Cost of the project has been estimated at 1.4 million dollars.

European Education Advanced by Land

Dr. S. Lewis Land, head of the department of industrial and vocational education, spent last year in Greece and Italy helping establish vocational teacher education programs in the universities of the two countries.

Land was asked to undertake this job by the Organization for European Economic Cooperation, as the organization was searching for an expert in the vocational teacher education field.

The OEEC was organized in 1948 to improve economic conditions in 18 European countries.

Both countries have such education programs in their universities, but none of the teachers have had professional training. Therefore, during the spring semester of 1958, 10 experts from Italy, five in agriculture and five in industry, will begin a year of intensive vocational education training at an American university. After their training these educators will set up programs in five Italian universities. These

programs will be modeled on the vocational education program of the University.

The five universities setting up vocational education programs will be the University of Padua, the University of Naples, the University of Bari, the University of Palermo and the University of Sassari.

Land spent six months in Italy and two-and-a-half months in Greece working with government officials and educators. The vocational education program is one solution to the problem of high unemployment. Land claims that an increase in trained workers will speed industrialization in Italy and Greece and will help to raise the standard of living.
