

Date Night Traffic Congestion Eased

The exit from the Hetzel Union parking lot onto Pollock Road and the ban on parking in front of Simmons and McElwain Residence Halls has eased traffic congestion on date nights there.

Both were recommendations of the 1957 Student Encampment.

The exit at the northwest corner of the parking lot was constructed this past summer and the parking ban went into effect this semester.

Although Encampment rec-

ommended "no parking" only on Friday and Saturday nights, the ban was made for all times.

In addition, Encampment recommended that campus patrolmen be stationed at the corner of Shortlidge and Pollock Roads; that a borough policeman be stationed at Pugh Street and College Avenue; and that the one-way traffic be reversed on the road leading from Shortlidge Road along the new women's dormitories.

Campus and town patrolmen are now stationed at these corners during the rush hours and the road from Shortlidge Road has been made one-way east. The latter channels traffic from Shortlidge Road, which is usually

jammed during these hours.

A Cabinet committee headed by John Yeosock worked on the traffic problems with Campus Patrol and borough police.

Yeosock said one recommendation to make the road behind Simmons and McElwain Halls one-way south was studied by the committee and it was found the two-way traffic caused no problem.

While the recommendation for the HUB parking lot onto Pollock Road was fulfilled, one for a second entrance to the lot from Shortlidge Road has apparently been rejected.

Yeosock said the recommendation was being studied by a Senate planning committee.

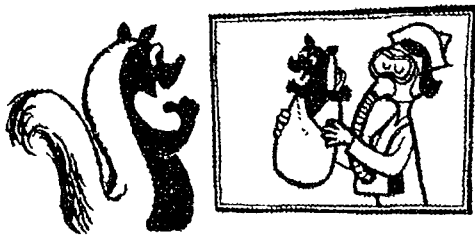
