## Five Sophomores Will Start Against Experienced Marquette

(Continued from page one) including the Lions' second leading ground-gainer (157 yards), Dave Kasperian. The others include right half Bucky Paolone, fullback Andy Moconyi and end Norm Neff. All suffered some type of injury in the Army test.

Two other Lion regulars will also be missing because of injuries and neither will dress for the contest. Fullback Pat Botula, the Lions' top rusher, with 194 yards in two games, is out with a sprained ankle, while Joe Bohart is sidelined with a shoulder injury.

Botula was injured in the Penn game and did not play against Army. According to Dr. Alfred Griess, team physician, he will not return to action until the Syracuse game two weeks from today. Up until his injury, Botula had been ranked as the nation's fourth best ground gainer.

Engle will start five sophomores against Marquette, including Dave Truitt and Henry Opperman at ends, Bob Gilmour at right tackle, Sam Sobczak at fullback and Jim Kerr at right half. Another sophomore — Dick Hoak at left half — will be added if the Lions open on defense.

Otherwise, the rest of the starting alignment will find Andy Stynchula at left tackle, Bud Kohlhaas and Bill Wehmer at guards, Captain Steve Garban at center, Richie Lucas at quarterback and Bruce Gilmore at left half (offensively). Maury Schleicher will start at end on defense. Although all are veterans, this is the first start this fall for Kohl-

haas, Lucas and Gilmore. Kohlhaas and Lucas gained the nod by showing two previous starters out of position — Kohlhaas replacing Chuck Ruslavage and Lucas taking over for Al Jacks. Lucas, incidentally, is the East's leading punter

with a 42.6 average in eight kicks.

Engle's alternate unit — which usually sees as much playing time as the first team — will have Schleicher and sophomore Jim Schwab at the ends, veterans Tom Mulraney and Chuck Janerette at tackles, sophomore Bill Popp and Ruslavage at guards, Wayne Berfield at center, Jacks at quarterback, sophomores Pat Funair

at fullback and sophomores Dick Hoak and Don Jonas at the fullbacks.

Popp, Berfield and Funair are new additions up from the reserves. Popp replaces Frank Korbini, Berfield steps in for Sam Stelatella and Funair moves up to Sobczak's vacated fullback slot. Schleicher, Janerette, Ruslavage and Jacks were starters last week, but their performances failed to impress Engle.

Marquette's John Druze, who assisted at Notre Dame for several years, will counter with a starting lineup which features eight lettermen. These include Silas Woods at right end, John Blyth at left tackle, Lou Castro and Captain Bill O'Connell at the guards, Gil Sedon at center, Frank Mestnik at fullback and Tim Zhulkie and Jim Webster at the halves. Webster has been hobbled by injuries this season and may be replaced by sophomore Dick Timmer.

Junior quarterback Pete Hall — a Pennsylvania native — and sophomores Jim Szarwark (tack-

## Frosh Open With W.Va.

A speedy, but untested, freshman football team will play West Virginia at 10 this morning on the practice gridiron on Beaver Field.

Coach Earl Bruce feeds that the line slots, particularly at end and tackle, are solid.

Of his backfield, Bruce commented, "I haven't been able to figure out whether my backs are good or if the defenses in scrimmages have been poor. The offense has been able to move the ball at will in the few scrimmages we have had."

Heading the backfield corps is 6-1, 185-pound Roger Kochman of Wilkinsburg. The high school fullback proved his speed in the PIAA's last year when he finished second in the 100 and 220 dashes. He will be running from the left halfback slot today.

Allen Brewster, one of the smallest players on the team at 5-9, 155 pounds, will handle the quarterbacking chores on the

opening unit. The Ridley Township field general made the AP All-State squad last year.
